FAILURE TO KEEP THE "FAR AWAY" SHAREHOLDERS INFORMED

Sir:—I doubt if the people of P. E. I. realize the damage done to the fox industry in general by this "silence" on the part of the officers or those in authority to speak for the several fox companies.

Because no dividends are forthcoming, but a reduction of the capitalization to normal, and although the ranches are properly and honestly managed the distant stockholder not hearing from his investment for two or three years which is not common—naturally concludes he has been robbed and that there is something "rotten in Denmark."

When in Charlottetown, a "guilty" officer said to me he could not get out a statement every time he had an inquiry as he could do nothing else, and thus eased his own conscience for a wrong doing, for I have never contended spending unnecessary time or money in getting out reports, but when two or three years elapse without sending a single word to those who helped finance their company in the early days, it is little less than a crime and legislation should be enacted in P. E. I. to force stock companies to make reports to their shareholders at least once every year.

It is this "silence" that gives the "crook" an opportunity to manipulate things to his own financial gain and to the loss of the original investor. Crime and wrong doing court darkness and on this line of reasoning the far away shareholder but concludes that "someone is juggling with his money."

I recently wrote an article for the Black Fox Magazine of New York City on the subject "An Unpardonable Sin" which was in line with this article and it brought me a number of personal letters from one of which I beg to quote:

"Your article in the Black Fox magazine, 'An Unpardonable Sin', in the October issue is a very good one and explains the situation thoroughly. I myself am one of the 'suckers' that got bit. I bought stock in three different companies each of which had a bank reference, and of these three only one is on the level and this one, although it has been unfortunate in the past, is honest and upright enough to inform its stockholders how things are getting along. The other two are either dishonest or have not been on the level with their stockholders for the last 3 years. I have written time and again to different officials of these companies, but I am still waiting for their reply. All they want apparently is my money, and all I get from them is a notice of a meeting once a year."

I don't believe the two companies referred to above are as bad as he thinks, yet the officers who should have at least answered some of his inquiries are doing the fox industry a vast amount of injury.

Just as I was leaving for P. E. I. November last a party here in Springfield asked me to look up the Fox Company stating that Mr. had sold considerable of the stock here some four years ago and that the stockholders could hear nothing from Mr.—or the company. When in Charlottetown I found the company was one of those highly capitalized companies organized four years ago, but that it was fast reducing its capitalization paying all running expenses and honestly managed, but this "silence" has led the stockholders here to believe there is something wrong, and this not reporting conditions has led to a general conclusion among the early far away investors in fox companies on P. E. I. that the industry is a fake, that the fox people are largely a "bunch of crooks" which you on the Island know to be wrong, but a reputation you have caused for yourselves.

Every company should and could get out a report to its stockholders once or twice a year and there is no reasonable excuse for not so doing, yet many of the fox companies on P. E. I. and some with large list of stockholders have not for two, three and some four years sent any kind of a statement to shareholders and even ignored their letters of inquiry. This is not only an "unpardonable sin" but little short of a crime, for with some of the stockholders it was money they could not afford to lose, but if they could get some sort of a report, they would be satisfied even if no dividends were paid and if they knew that as with

most of the early companies they were passing through a reduction of capital per fox which is as it should be.

ABSOLUTION CORPORA

Impressive Ceremony in Montreal in Connection With Death of Dr. R.A. Donohue of P. E. I.

A Montreal correspondent writing under date of Dec. 2nd, says: The impressive ceremony of the Absolution corpore present, was held last evening at 5 o'clock in the Sodality Chapel attached to St. Patrick's Church over the remains of Dr. Robert A. Donohue, a native of Cardigan, King's County, Prince Edward Island, who died recently at Roanville, Saskatchewan, where he had practised medicine since graduating from McGill University in 1908.

The celebrant was the pastor of St. Patrick's, the Rev. Gerald McShane, D. D., the deacon and subdeacon being respectively the Rev. Father George Bradley, S. J., of the College of the Immaculate Conception and the Rev. Father Coffin, C. S. S. R., of St. Ann's Redemptorist Church, both former fellow students with the deceased at St. Dunstan's College, Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island.

In the Sanctuary the assisting clergy Rev. F. S. McDonald, S. J., Rev. Austin Bradley, S. J., Rev. Lucien Teesdale, S. J., of the Immaculate Conception College, but formerly of Prince Edward Island, and the Rev. M. P. Reid, chaplain of the Columbian Club, for McGill students, of which Dr. Donohue has been an active member.

A large gathering of citizens and friends also attended, Dr. Donohue being well known in social and athletic circles, as an all round sportsman, having been also a member of the team of Shamrock A. A. which won the Rugby Football Championship of Canada in 1904.

Among the delegates present was a guard of honor of the Knights of Columbus of Canada and Dominion Council, a body of fifty McGill students of the Columbian Club led by Mr. J. A. MacDougall, its president, who also had been a fellow student of the deceased at St. Dunstan's, and the Shamrock A. A., represented locally by Messrs. T. J. Statters, Mr. McCole, and P. Kenahan.

The family was represented by the Rev. James Donohue, P. P. St. Paul, Minneapolis, brother; Dr. Emmett J. Mullally, of Montreal, brother-in-law; Mrs. G. J. Mullally, and Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Mullally and the Rev. Thomas Mullally, S. J. Others attending were Messrs. F. S. Macdonald, Leo Bradley, and Rev. Brother Elias (Stephens), of Prince Edward Island; Messrs. M. A. Phelan, K. C., M. J. Hackett, J. A. O.
