MEETING OF THE GRAND LODGE I.O.G.T.

Proceedings of the Second Day at Montague—Report on State of Order.

The second day's meeting of the Good Templars at Montague was most interesting. Two new members received the Grand Lodge degree. The consideration of the report of the Committee on the state of the Order occupied considerable time, as nearly every clause was discussed. The report was adopted and is as follows:—

Your Committee on the state of the Order reports as follows:—

(1st) That we join with the officers of this Grand Lodge in congratulating ourselves on the progress made during twenty new Lodges being organized by our deceased brother, Wallace Fraser, increasing our membership to 1387. This happy condition of affairs is largely due to the untiring efforts of Brother Fraser, and we hereby record our heartfelt appreciation of his many sterling qualities, and his wide-spread influence of good. Your Committee recommend that this Grand Lodge in some way perpetuate his memory, and we would suggest that a lapel photo button be secured by the Grand Secretary and sold to the Lodges at cost, to be disposed of by them to the members in any way they desire.

(2nd) That we commend the proposal of the Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance to hold a grand temperance demonstration during the summer and endorse what our Executive Committee has already done in appointing four members, namely: A. D. Fraser, T. S. Rober son, T. E. Bulpitt and Rev. D. R. Chowan, to represent our Order on the General Committee.

(3rd) We recommend that the incoming Executive put forth every effort to continue the work of strengthening existing Lodges, and organizing new ones wherever possible.

(4th) We rejoice in the successful issue of the campaign for the repeal of the Scott Act by which the provincial prohibition law, the best law for the suppression of the liquor traffic in the world, has now become law throughout the Province. In this connection we feel that it is not the duty of this Grand Lodge, being a provincial body, to recommend an inspector for Kings Co., under the prohibition act; but we do recommend that this Grand Lodge appoint a committee of three to confer with the Committee already appointed by

the Kings Co. Temperance Alliance to recommend a suitable person, and that this Committee be requested to act without delay. We, however, agree with the action taken by other temperance bodies in the Province in recommending that we have an experienced man as Chief Inspector for the whole Province.

(5th) When inspectors are appointed we trust that every Good Templar will do all in his power to aid the Inspectors in the discharge of their duties, and we conceive in the Grand Chief Templar's suggestion that each Lodge have a Committee to work in conjunction with those who aid the Inspector in enforcing the law.

(6th) We would most strongly protest against the appointment of Vendors under the Provincial Prohibition Act anywhere in the Province, as we believe they are not required.

(7th) In regard to the 13th Order of business in the Subordinate Lodge Ritual, your Committee believe that the passing of a by-law by Subordinate Lodges requiring the Chief Templar to ask the question, "Has any member violated the obligation?" would have a beneficial effect.

(8th) We commend the efforts made during the year to organize for District Work and hope that the work of District Lodges may be vigorously extended and prosecuted during the coming year.

(9th) We would express our hearty sympathy with our Grand Chief Templar in his long and painful illness during the year, also our sincere gratitude for his recovery. Your Committee feel that our Order is under deep obligation to him for his untiring efforts to advance the interests
