ITALIANS KILL OR CAPTURE WHOLE ENEMY GARRISON

ROME, August 15.—The capture or killing of an entire garrison of an enemy post in the upper Zebra valley was announced by the war office today. "An Italian patrol, overcoming the difficulties of terrain, killed or captured the garrison of an enemy advanced post at a height of 2,682 metres in the upper Zebra valley, says the statement. Our patrols returned unharmed. "In the Lagarina Vallarsa sector in the Pontè Della area there was intense artillery fire," two enemy machines have been brought down.

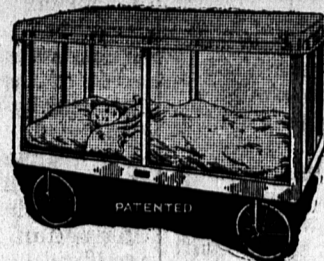

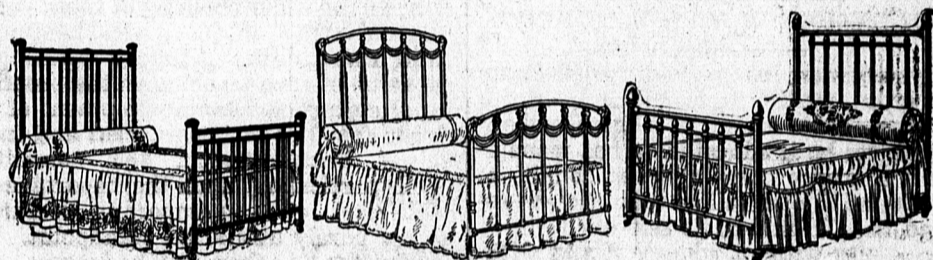
