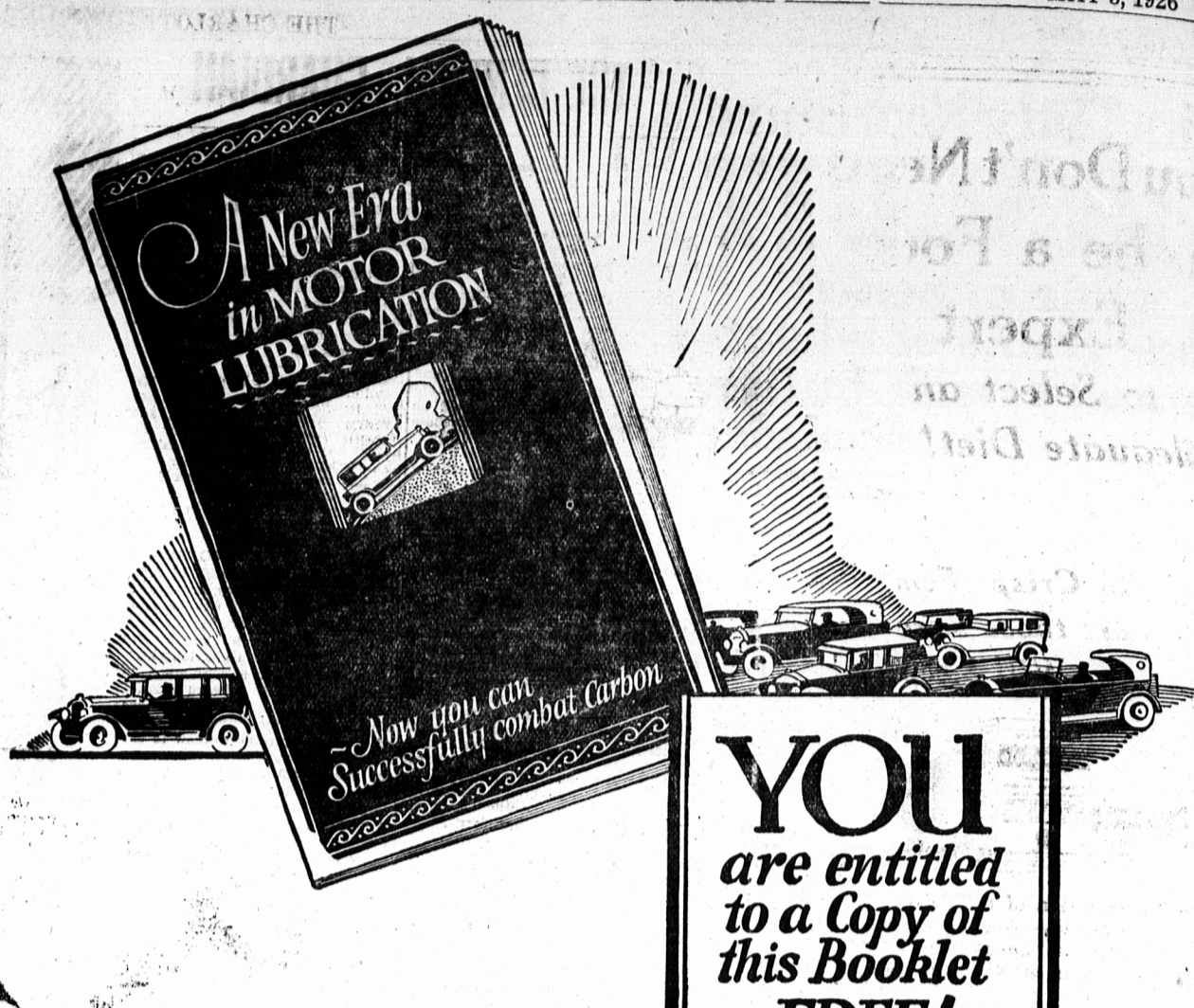

Meantime a universal demand for cars is reported all over the Prairies.

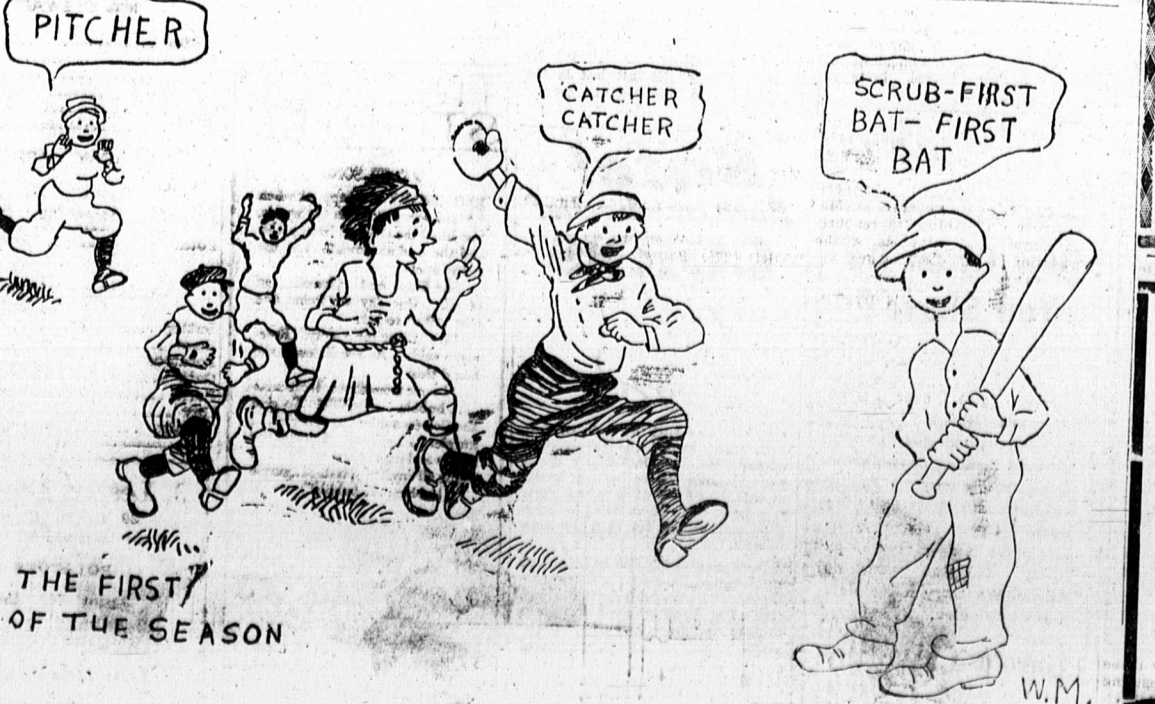
