TORONTO, March 7—(CP)—Mining and western oil stocks 10-12. Mining and western oil stocks today on the Toronto exchange. Volume at 230,000 was the heaviest in three weeks.

The market feature was Sleep Rock, a heavy seller of falling prices through the session. A report that the Ontario Government was not likely to approve the diversion of the Stene River, so that the mine property could be drained, evidently started the selling and the price broke to 81. It recovered a few cents to close at 85 for a net loss of 23 cents. About 37,000 shares of the stock was sold.

Noranda and Nickel weakened 1-4. Ventures was off 20 cents to 3.15 and other base metals were steady. Home Oil was down 9 cents to 1.85 and Calgary-Edmonton 4 cents to 1.11.

Dominion Stores and Loblaw A gained 1-2 and smaller fractions were added by Weston and National Grocers. Canada Steamships pfd was again in demand and the price firmed a point at 71. Other issues firming a point or more included Canada Wire A, Bank of Commerce and Imperial Bank. The market was soft for Cannors B, Harris Pfd, Royal Bank and Bank of Montreal.

Kerr-Addison was one of the weakest of the goods. It dropped to 34 and closed at 34 for a net loss of 25 cents. Preston netted 8 cents to 2.50 and Lises of 4 to 10 cents were netted by Auhor, Brohan, Chas and Canada and MacLeod-Cockshutt. Brohan was a heavy seller at a drop of 4 cents to close at 89.

**NEW YORK, March 7—(AP)—**Stocks generally lost their rallying exuberance in today's market although few developed any real weakness.

Canadian issues were fairly steady. Walkers, Brazilian Tractor and Lake Shore Mines gained trifles. International Nickel was easy. The Associated Press average of 80 stocks was unchanged at 412. Transfers of 361,200 shares compared with 490,010 yesterday.

Among stocks, Universal Pictures, an odd-lot issue, jumped 5 points on a 20-share turnover. Ending with modest improvement were Sears Roebuck, Woolworth, North American, Southern Pacific, J. I. Case, International Harvester, U.S. Gypsum, Eastman Kodak, Johns-Manville, Allied Chemical and Westinghouse. On the losing end were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Republic Steel, Youngstown sheet, General Motors, Chrysler, U.S. Rubber, Montgomery Ward, Douglas Aircraft, United Aircraft, Santa Fe, N.Y. Central, Great Northern, Noranda, Kennecott, General Electric and Texas Co. p.

**Central Farmers' Institute**

Following the Dairymen's meeting on Thursday, March 13, a general open meeting will be held, for which discussions on Agriculture have been arranged. This meeting will be in the form of an open forum. It will be under the chairmanship of the President of the Central Farmers' Institute.

very low cost. For instance, tea or cocoa cost one penny. No item costs more than two pence. Each station platform is fitted with ovens and electric boilers, each holding ten gallons, and there are 600 of these. More than half a mile of water mains have been put in. There are in all 134 such canteen points spread among the 80 stations.

At the present time tea and cocoa are served to the extent of 12,500 gallons a night to about 100,000 shelterers for whom are distributed about seven tons of food. Be it understood that by no means all or even the majority of these people have been bombed out of their homes; most of them are there for the safety of the platforms. Nor in general are they of the type we used to call the submerged tenth.

All this has been done under the auspices of the Ministry of Food in co-operation with the London Passenger Transport Board and the Local Borough Councils. And the Lord Mayor's Fund has provided a £15,000 for the equipment. It may indeed become the fashion to do sheltering—the type of stations at now among the sights of war time London.

Anyone travelling in the London Tubes, now, is very likely to see a train of about six cars slide alongside the platform; and every window he will see a large black and white poster.

"Refreshment Train"

There are now six of these trains in operation. One or other of them draws up at one of eighty stations of the underground which have been selected to be used at night as shelters.

From the trains are discharged large supplies of tea, cocoa, buns, cake, hot pies, sausages and, indeed almost all the eatables which are commonly to be found in places of "light refreshment". There is no alcohol. These are received and served later by girls in bright costumes—apple green dresses, red aprons and smart little red turbans—at least that is what one of the girls tell me they call them. The effect is almost gipsy like. One thousand girls have been recruited for the job.

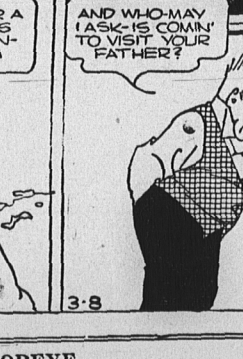
