Work of Ch'Town Poet Included In War Anthology

The Canadian Army Anthology of Poetry which is to be published by the Public Relations Branch, U. S. H. Q., will include three poems by William Brown, Charlottetown; Donald Edgar Forbes, Tyn Valley; Margaret Jean MacQuarrie, Roseneath; Peter Ellis Rogers, Charlottetown; Norris Bartley Ward, Charlottetown; Hensley Charles Palmer, Roseville; Lewis Huggan Lowther, Charlottetown. The poems by DeCoste which were chosen for inclusion in the Anthology are "Light of Battle", "The Call of Christ", and "Sound Bugle Sound". The latter poem is inscribed in tribute to Lieutenant Edward A. (Ted) Wilson of Charlottetown who was killed in action in N.W. Europe in 1944. The Anthology contains some three hundred poems written by active service members of the Canadian Forces. The poems in the Anthology were chosen from some two thousand poems submitted by Army Chaplains on behalf of the poets in their respective units. DeCoste is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur DeCoste of Prince St., Charlottetown.
