In one word, if the weather be favorable the yielding of the grain crop will be far above the ordinary.—R.

### AN AMERICAN STEAMER BURNED.

NASSAU, Bahama Islands, Sept. 29.—The American steamer Foxton Hall was burned off Watlings Island, September 29. The members of the crew, with the exception of two men who are missing, have arrived here. The steamer Foxton Hall was the first vessel to take out an American register since the outbreak of hostilities in Europe. She originally was a British vessel and the change in registration was made at Colon, September 19, on which date the Foxton Hall sailed from the Isthmus for Perth Amboy, N. J. The steamer was commanded by Captain Stevenson and was of 4,427 tons and 368 feet long. She was built in 1902.
