**Dr. F. E. M. Read Home On Vacation To Alberton**

—Dr. Frances E. M. Read of Baltimore, Maryland, accompanied by her mother, Mrs. Geraldine Read is spending a vacation on the Island. Dr. Read graduated from McGill University Arts B. A. 1929; Medicine M. D., C. M., 1933. She received an appointment to the Johns Hopkins Hospital in 1933 and has been there for the past 14 years.

She had a brilliant record at McGill receiving most of the scholastic honors and has continued to receive similar honors at Johns Hopkins.

Dr. Read is a Director of the Harriet Lane, Johns Hopkins Hospital Clinic for children. She is the first and only woman doctor to be on the Medical Board of the Johns Hopkins Hospital. She has done an enormous amount of research in rheumatic fever and has published extensive articles and monographs in the leading medical journals. She is engaged in private practice in Baltimore as a consulting specialist in children's diseases. She is a member of the Pediatric Specialty Board and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics. Dr. Read has just attended the International Congress of Pediatrics in the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. This meeting was attended by the leading pediatricians from every country in the world.

She has been elected to "Who is Who in America." Dr. Read is a member of the Gibson Island Club. Dr. Read and her mother motored down to the Island, where they are visiting their many relatives.

Dr. Read's mother, Mrs. Geraldine Read has a beautiful shore property located on the Mill Road, which she plans to retain permanently as their summer home on the Island.

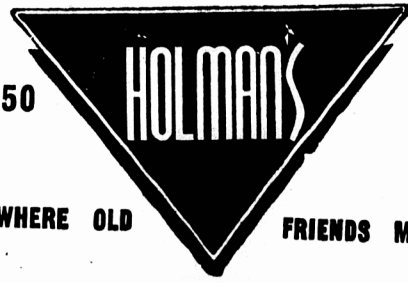
