(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Que., Jan. 27—Ralph "Cooney" Weiland, diminutive centre star of the champion Boston Bruins, has forged to the front as the leading goal getter of the National Hockey League. Weiland has

now notched 25 goals as against 23 for Stewart, but on points, Weiland gives way to Frankie Boucher, who has compiled 45 points in all, scoring 19 goals and furnishing 28 assists. American division scores continue to eclipse those of the international section by a substantial margin. Stewart retains the lead in the Canadian with 8 assists in addition to his 23 goals for a total of 32 points. Joe Lambe, has moved up to third position, displacing his team mate Frank "King" Clancy.

Premium Rates per \$1,000 of Insurance

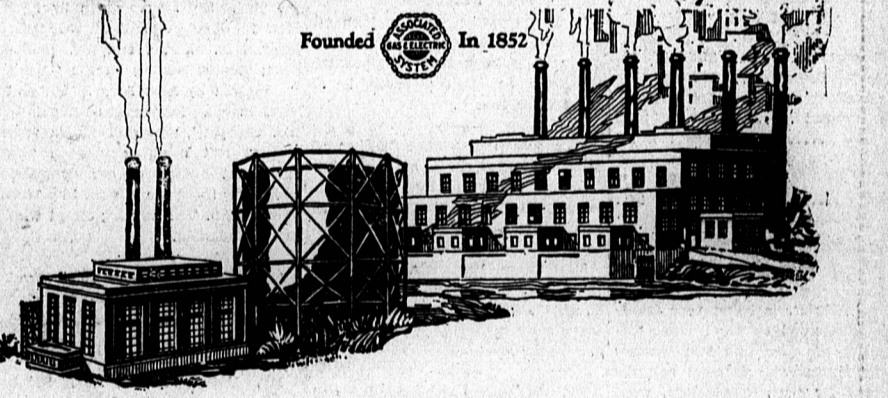
