Geo and Mrs. Shelton, Tignish, are receiving the congratulations of their friends on the arrival of a young son on Wednesday last.

The schooner J. B. Martin is loading lumber for Fall River, Mass., at Halifax. This vessel is owned by Joseph Read & Co., and Capt. Cain, of Summerside, is in command.

The friends of Miss Minnie Deegan will be pleased to learn she has completely recovered from a serious operation in the Hospital and is now at home with her parents Alexander and Mrs. Deegan, Cape Traverse.

The Guardian should have said Saturday that the many friends of Harry H. Clark, Augustine Cove, who underwent an operation in the P. E. Island Hospital, will be pleased to learn that he is steadily improving and expects to return home in a few days.

The schooner Malabar is being loaded with seed oats for the Ontario market by Jos. Read & Co., Summerside. The schooner Telephone is being loaded with seed oats by the same firm for the New Brunswick markets and the schooner Enterprise is also being loaded by them with seed oats for the Nova Scotia market.

At the Police Court on Saturday morning last, the young lad who had been arrested on suspicion of being implicated in the stealing of the poultry from the Clifton House, was given a hearing before Stipendiary Magistrate. Some nine or ten witnesses, mostly all boys, who had been keeping company with the accused, were examined, but the evidence was conflicting, and not strong enough to connect him with the stealing and he was therefore discharged.

On account of a mix up in the following local is repeated: Dealers in Summerside, Friday were paying from fifteen to seventeen cents per pound for butter, fifteen cents per dozen for eggs, eight dollars per ton for loose hay, four dollars and fifty cents for straw, forty-seven cents for pork, ten cents per pound for geese, chickens and ducks, fifteen cents per lb for turkey and eight cents per lb for fowl.

The death took place at Tignish, on Wednesday last of David Villiard, one of the oldest and most respected residents of that place. Deceased was born in Souris eighty-three years ago, and had for the past 45 years, resided at Tignish. He leaves to mourn a widow and one son John of Charlottetown, Senior Ordnance Officer of P. E. I. The funeral took place on Friday morning last at the R. C. Cemetery, Tignish, Rev. A. J. McDougall conducting the funeral services. The pall bearers were Edward Hackett, Charles Dalton, J. J. McLellan, L. S. Perry, Agno Gaudet and Chas. Carter.
