## THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

### Railway Wharf.

Sir:—The following resolution speaks for itself:  
A special meeting of the Council of the Summerside Board of Trade was held Monday evening when two important resolutions were unanimously passed, said resolutions to be forwarded by Hon. R. C. McLeod to the Minister of Marine. The first resolution asks Sir Louis H. Davies to cause the steamers Minto and Stanley when they run to Charlottetown to land freight at the railway wharf, instead of at Connolly's wharf as heretofore. The change asked for by the resolution would save great expenses to importers, and there is no good reason why the steamers should not go direct to the railway wharf. This wharf has been thoroughly dredged, giving the boats plenty of water, and goods can be landed right on the cars, thus saving expense of truckage, and the damage to goods as well which results from extra handling.

There is another season, and a very serious one, why the winter boats should not go to Connolly's Wharf. Last fall the warehouses on this wharf were flooded; this may occur again, when there is a large inward freight, and then who will be responsible for the damage, Government, Agent, Insurance or consignee? It is too late to make the change after the loss is sustained. If Sir Louis objects to their coming to the Railway Wharf, let them be sent to the Steam Nav. Co. Wharf, where there is large and good warehouse accommodation, the warehouses having been raised this winter to prevent their being flooded.  
Shippers would do well to enter a vigorous protest against this grievance, and our Board of Trade should act at once in this important matter, supporting the efforts of the Summerside Board of Trade.

### Prayers for the Dead

SIR,—In reply to your leader on Prayers for the Dead in this morning's issue, will you allow me to call your attention to certain facts which perhaps have escaped your notice, and may be new to some of your readers.

I.—The judgment of the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Jenner Fust, B. N. T., D. C. L., delivered in the Archdeaconry Court of Canterbury (the highest Ecclesiastical Court in the Church of England) in the case of Brecks versus Woolgreay, Nov. 19, 1833, declared that prayers for the dead, were not contrary to the doctrines of the Church of England.

II.—The Archbishop of Canterbury, as Primate of the Church of England, has authorized certain prayers to be said in English Churches, during war with South Africa, these included a prayer for the souls of those who had fallen in battle or died of disease.

III. In the House of Lords, one of the members took exception to this prayer and brought it to the notice of the House. The Archbishop defended his action and claimed that prayers for the departed were perfectly legal in the Church of England, but need not be used by those who objected to them.

IV. Upon the death of Queen Victoria, Messrs. Eyre and Spottiswoode, the King's Printers, issued two forms of memorial services, authorized for use in Churches; one of these services contains the following petition: "May the Lord of His mercy grant to us, with all the faithful departed rest and peace." Of course when the King's Printers issue authorized services, it is understood that they are authorized by the highest authority in the Church of England.

V. At the memorial service for this Queen held in St. Paul's Cathedral, London, the Anthem of the Dead was, "Give rest, O Christ, to Thy servant with Thy Saints."

I hold then that I am acting in full accord with the teaching of the Church of England in asking my people to pray for the soul of Victoria. I have no intention of entering into a religious controversy, so refrain from giving the Scriptural authority for this teaching. Only I would say that the Church of England believes that she can find warrant in Holy Scripture for all her doctrines.

We certainly agree with you upon one point—"that probation ends with this life." The next life is not one of probation but of progression.
