### SHEEP AND DEER CLIP FAIRWAYS.

MONTREAL, Que., Aug. 14.—In the Old Country there are many golf courses which permit the grazing of flocks of sheep in order to crop the grass on the fairways. On this continent the tractor and the gang cutters are most frequently used, but for sheer originality Jasper Park merits high distinction," remarked Stanley Thompson, the golf architect of the noted Canadian golf family, and designer of the course constructed at Jasper National Park by the Canadian National Railways.

Mr. Thompson continued his explanation, which was given during the course of a visit to Montreal recently. "Herds of male deer and elk found their way to the course and began feeding on the fairways. It was first thought well to drive them off when the season began, but it was decided that their work in cropping and fertilizing earned their board, and so they remain. The greens are too closely cropped for their liking and they seek the choice morsels in the fairways." Speaking of conditions at Jasper, where the amateur championship of the Royal Canadian Golf Association will take place from August 19th to 24th, Mr. Thompson

remarked, "It is absolutely at its very best, owing to the generous manner in which the course has been piped, allowing watering of fairways as well as greens, the turf is in lovely condition and one might almost play a driver instead of a brassy many times in the course of a round."

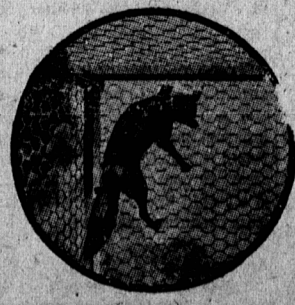
