THE DAUGHTERS OF THE EMPIRE.

This is an imperial and patriotic order organized among the women of Canada, whose aims and objects are expressed in the motto, One Flag, One Throne, One Empire.

The Guardian is in receipt of a letter from Miss Merritt, Honorary Organising Secretary of the order telling of the efforts that have been made and are now being made to extend its influence and usefulness.

This September the President, Mrs. Nordheimer, proposes to send a committee eastward to Montreal, Sherbrooke, Quebec, Moncton, Amherst, Truro, Yarmouth, New Glas-

gow, Sydney, St. John's, N. F., Picton, Charlottetown, Summerside, St. John, Fredericton and Chatham for the purpose of forming new Chapters and visiting those already established.

Miss Merritt adds: "We wish to do a woman's part in creating amongst the children and in the schools the spirit of patriotism, which the Naval Conference and the Imperial Press Congress aroused amongst the men."

The Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire has 125 Chapters in Canada alone, besides members in the West Indies and amongst the British born women of the United States, and a membership of 10,000 women and children.

CANADA'S COAL TRADE.

During the year ended with March last Canada imported nearly 11,000,000 tons of coal at a cost of over \$27,000,000. Three million tons of this was anthracite from the United States and cost \$14,500,000.

Anthracite coal is admitted to Canada free of duty. On soft coal the duties collected in Canada are 45 cents per ton and 12 cents on slack.

The logic of the conditions in regard to coal is strongly in favor of reciprocity which would give the Nova Scotia mines a free market in New England and the British Columbia mines a free market in the contiguous states of the Pacific coast.

THE ROMANCE OF AN ESTATE.

The late Senator George W. Fulford, born in 1852, made a fortune rapidly in manufacturing medicines. He was called to the Senate in 1900 and died a few years ago leaving a fortune of over two million dollars.

Mrs McLean has since died leaving an infant child which also died a few hours after its mother. Then arose the question whether or not the valuable estate descended to Mr McLean as he claimed or to other heirs.

Thus in a few brief years Mr Fulford's fortune, so rapidly accumulated passed from his hands to his daughter, from her to an unconscious infant and from the infant child to its father.

THE NORTHWEST CROPS.

In 1905 the Canadian Northwest produced 82 1/2 million bushels of wheat; in 1906 the crop was 110 1/2 millions; in 1907 it was 71 1/2 millions; in 1908 it was 91 1/2 millions and last year 123 million bushels.

The disappointment lies in the fact that with a much larger area the crop is less than it was four years ago; that the shortest yield is in sections longest settled, giving a hint, after making all due allowance for a dry season, that some sections where the soil is thin may already feel the effect of too frequent cropping.

The British mint last year coined over eight million farthings. We have not yet felt the need of a coin in Canada of less value than a cent, but there is evidently some use for it in the Old Country for such coins or they would not be produced in such numbers.

A company for the manufacture of beet root sugar is being organized in British Columbia, which will make the fourth in Canada. There are now two in Ontario and one in Alberta.

The world's yearly production of coal is stated to be over a billion tons, worth over two billions of dollars. Nearly two millions of men are employed in the mining and quarrying of minerals in the British Empire, more than half of whom are employed in getting out coal.

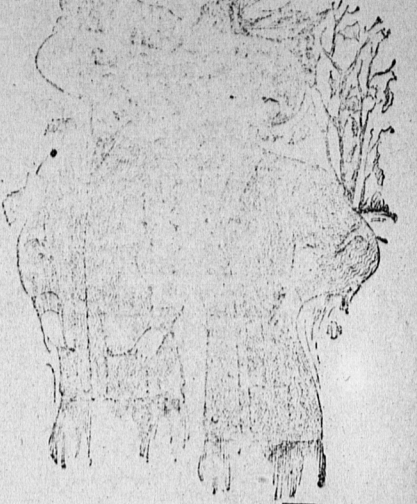
