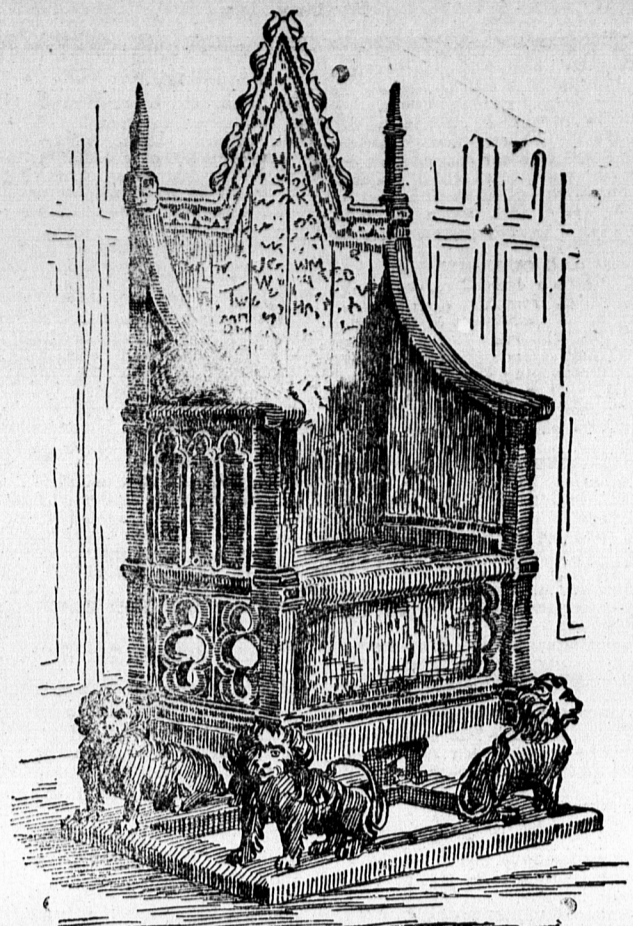

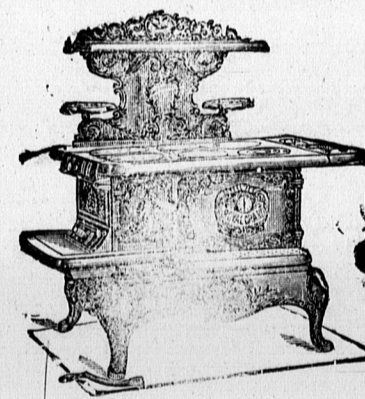

### WINNIPEG TO REGINA.

WINNIPEG, Oct. 15.—Another step in the forward march of western progress was made on Saturday when Winnipeg was placed in direct telegraphic communication with Regina over the new lines of the Canadian Northern railway company. The advent of the C. N. R. wires gives Regina two telegraphic lines with direct service to Winnipeg.

### A NEW JEROME PLAY

LONDON, Oct. 15.—Jerome K. Jerome's new play, "Fanny and Servant Problem," was produced at the Aldwych Theatre last night by Miss Fanny Ward, under the management of Marc Klaw. The play is a quaint and entertaining comedy farce and was received with great favor.

### A CAVE FULL OF BONES.

LONDON, Oct. 15.—In the Isle of Egg, one of the Hebrides, is a cave into which one can hardly creep on hands and knees. Inside it widens enormously and runs down to the terrific depth of 250 feet. To this day the bottom is strewn thick with human bones, the relics of the whole clan of Macdonalds, over 200 in number, who were miserably suffocated by the Macleods from the island of Skye. This tragedy is supposed to have occurred in the thirteenth century.

### ON HARVARD AND YALE.

BOSTON, Oct. 16.—Although it is nearly six months since the Harvard and Yale began their regular nightly trips between Boston and New York for the present season, there has not been a single mishap of any description whatsoever during that time. This fact alone speaks volumes not only for the officers and crew of the Harvard and Yale, but also for the Metropolitan Steamship Company's service, of which the two magnificent steel turbines are a part. Absolute safety combined with speed, and the comfort afforded by perfect accommodations, assure the patrons of these steamers that they will arrive at their destination on time, and that the voyage thereto will be thoroughly delightful. The popularity of this all-the-way-by-water route continues the same as in midsummer, and each evening the report of full passenger and state-room lists comes from each steamer. The fifteen-hour schedule between the two ports, which is steadily adhered to by the steamers, means that leaving Boston at 5 o'clock in the afternoon one is due to arrive in New York at 8 the following morning, or vice versa. The steamers leave from India Wharf, Boston, and from Pier 45, North River, foot of West Tenth Street, New York.

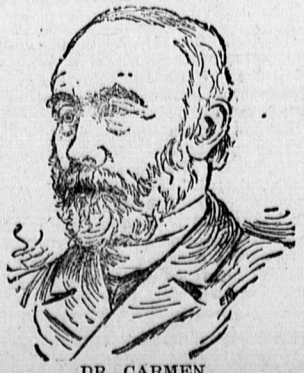
