Crop Report
WINNIPEG, Man., Aug. 2—Rain has been fairly general over the prairies during the past week-end. As a result, crop conditions are improved. Conditions are excellent in Manitoba with all grain filling well. In Saskatchewan conditions are improved in all areas except the district north east of Saskatoon where rain is still needed.
In the west-central district, conditions are such that at least feed will be obtained. In Alberta a fair crop is in prospect in most areas, rain having been received in all areas except north and west of Edmonton, according to the weekly crop report of the Department of Agriculture of the Canadian National Railways.
