### THE PRESIDENT FOR RECIPROCITY.

Mr. McKinley's first introduction to the people of Canada was an unfavorable one, as the nominal author of the famous McKinley tariff of 1890. That tariff was a severe blow to our export trade; it hit us pretty hard and necessitated a considerable readjustment of our producing industry. Since he became President however, Mr. McKinley "has been so clear in his great office," so courteous and friendly toward Britain, that Canadians had come to regard him not only with friendly feelings but with a measure of admiration. It has since transpired that the McKinley tariff was intended by Mr. McKinley himself not as a permanent thing but as a means to an end; The object was to first secure the home market and thus establish the industries of the Republic on such a basis that her manufacturers and producers should be able to compete on equal terms with any and all competitors. The President some time since apparently concluded that the time had come for a new fiscal departure in the direction of freer trade relations. When he set out on his tour of the States some months ago he had apparently determined to do some educational work along that line, but the series of speeches which he had intended to deliver was interrupted by Mrs. McKinley's illness.

At the Buffalo Exposition however, just before his life was attempted the President spoke out in favor of a broad and enlightened trade policy in terms which cannot be misunderstood. Among other things he said:

A system which provides mutual exchanges of commodities is manifestly essential to the continued and healthy growth of our export trade. We must not repose in fancied security that we can forever sell everything and buy little or nothing. What we produce beyond our domestic consumption must have a vent abroad. The excess must be relieved through a foreign outlet, and we should sell everywhere we can and buy wherever the buying will enlarge our sales and production, and thereby make a greater demand for home labor. The period of exclusiveness is past; the expansion of our trade and commerce is the present problem. If perchance some of our tariffs no longer needed for revenue or to encourage and protect our industries at home why should they not be employed to extend and promote our markets abroad?

We regard this deliverance as a very important one, both to the American people to whom it was addressed and to Canada also. It is a clear declaration that a change of policy, a change in the direction of reciprocity, or of greatly lowered tariffs, has become necessary to the United States. We on this side of the line would welcome such a change. Not that we cannot go on and prosper despite the high tariff walls within which our nearest neighbor has entrenched himself. We have in fact demonstrated our commercial and industrial independence by developing home industries on an

extensive scale and a foreign commerce far greater proportionately to population than the commerce of the Republic, despite the hostile tariff.


None the less Canada would welcome a departure in the direction of a freer interchange of commodities with the United States. Our trade with the Republic is already very great, notwithstanding the existing restrictions and would be enormously greater were those restrictions even in part removed. The President, should his life be spared, as we hope and trust it may, will have great influence in shaping the trade policy of his party and of the nation, and it may be found that a measure of reciprocity between the two countries can be brought about more speedily than had been hoped.
