THE navigation with Charlottetown and Southport was suspended for some time Saturday. The ferry boat leaving about ten o'clock was caught in the ice and did not get clear in the afternoon till after three. She was carried up almost to the Bridge.

DURING the past week R. E. Mutch & Co. have purchased and shipped to Upper Canada over sixty tons of pork. They have also raised the price to 53 cents for select. The firm will continue buying and it is their intention to handle all the pork that may offer.

McNEILL, Chief of Fruit Division, Ottawa, Prof. Macoun and Dr. Fletcher of the Experimental Farm will be present at the meetings of the Fruit Growers on Dec. 24th and 25th and will deliver addresses. Mr. McNeill will also give demonstrations on the grading and packing of apples in barrels and boxes and the proper marking of the packages.

ONCE more sugar is increasing in price and the prophecy made by some of the dealers a few weeks ago that a further increase of a cent a pound is now being generally accepted by those who at first ridiculed the idea. London advices say sales for December delivery have been made at 14 shillings and 3 pence. This is an advance of three pence over previous reported sales. Speculation in this commodity is also stated on the increase. A sale of Java sugar for delivery at Liverpool has been reported at a price equivalent to four and seven-eighths cents. This is one eighth of a cent per pound higher than has previously been paid in New York. The Federal Sugar Refining Co. of New York yesterday advanced the price of refined sugars ten cents per hundred pounds on all grades. Advances of a further advance are expected at any hour.

CAPITAL PUNISHMENT IN CANADA.

During the past twenty-four years 211 death sentences have been passed in Canada. Of the persons so sentenced 130 were executed. The sentences of 81 were commuted to imprisonment for life, and of these prisoners 54 were pardoned after serving various periods. A certain percentage of murderers are not discovered and many others are found guilty of manslaughter, or are not convicted at all and from this record it appears that more than one-third of those sentenced to death are not executed, and that more than one-fourth are not imprisoned for life. The death penalty seems on the whole to be rather the exception than the rule. St. John Sun.

SLIGHTLY MIXED.

MONTREAL, Dec. 8.—The Herald tonight published a story under a scarce head that the reason why Borden did not immediately agree to continue in the conservative leadership is that at the caucus here W. F. McLean, M. P. for East York, made a speech demanding that the matter be left over until a full caucus of the party could be held at Ottawa. Mr. McLean is also stated to have remarked in the course of his speech that it would do the Conservative party no good to have as a leader a man who had not sufficient weight to carry his own or a single seat in his native province. The trouble with the story is that McLean was not at the caucus, and consequently did not make the speech with which he is credited.

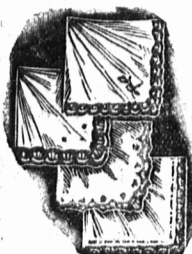
