SUBSTITUTE FOR GASOLINE

Discovery that Promises to Revolutionize Motor Propulsion Substitute to Cost Three Cents a Gallon.

STONEHAM, Mass., May 10.—The death knell of gasoline as a motive agent in the propulsion of the automobile has been sounded, according to the dictum of Daniel E. Smith, a well-known lawyer, whose home is in this town, and who claims to have discovered a combination of simple chemicals that, mixed with water, may be sold at three cents a gallon and will drive a car of any make as easily and as rapidly as will gasoline, if the price of which looms large in the eyes of every car owner.

Mr. Smith is not a theorist simply. He has perfected the combination, for which he makes this claim, which is as startling as that of the New York gentleman who has recently been exalted in the press of the country as a public benefactor.—Mr. Smith goes a step farther, and stands ready to demonstrate the practical efficiency of his invention.

Today he took an auto in Stoneham, and in the presence of the chauffeur, O. G. Pratt, a local civil engineer, and representatives of Boston news-papers, emptied into the street its supply of gasoline, the witnesses certifying to the conditions, and then poured in a quart of colorless liquid from a glass milk bottle.

The party five in all, got into the car, and without delay the engine was started and the car was run to the Greenwood line and back, maintaining a speed of from 20 to 25 miles an hour. Up grades had no terror for this new agent, which, for lack of a better name, Mr. Smith calls motive gas.

The inventor says the chemical used are simple, are of American manufacture, and can be acquired anywhere. Mr. Smith says the operator of a car after filling the tank with the mixture, can carry several bottles of the combination with him, and when the tank supply runs short can pour in five gallons of water empty in the contents of a six-ounce bottle, and resume his journey.—Boston Globe.

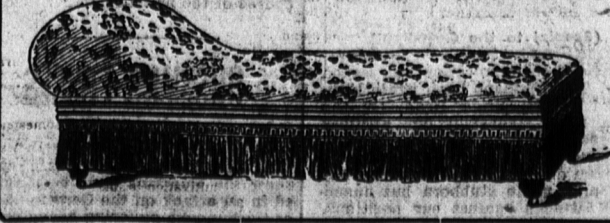
