ROYAL GUESTS ARE ARRIVING OFFICIALLY NOW

LONDON, June 16—The Official arrival of the King's guests for the coronation will begin today when the foreign representative—such as the Chinese and Japanese—who have been here for some time in a private capacity, will be received at the Court from Windsor and the constant arrival of new visitors, the remaining few days before the coronation will see a continuous round of social entertaining.

Among the important features of the coronation will be the lighting of two thousand bon-fires all over the Kingdom at 10 o'clock on the night of June 22nd, while the immense fleet, which is now assembling at Spithead will be illuminated from 9.30 o'clock until 11 o'clock on that night. The whole fleet will also fire a royal salute of 21 guns at the time of the crowning ceremony in the Abbey.

Speaking last night at a dinner given to representative of the West Indies who have arrived here for the coronation, Mr. Asquith said that the outlook for the Colonies was full of promise, and not less so by reason of the fact that the Panama Canal was approaching completion. The ultimate effects of that great enterprise were at present incalculable but could hardly be doubted he said, it would in the long run favorably influence the economic progress of the West Indies.

Dr. Orville Owen, who has been searching the River Wye for the manuscripts of the Shakespearean plays which he believes were hidden by Bacon, has made a new discovery in his explorations of the Wye which he asserts fits in with his cypher. It is a triangle stone structure thirteen feet high under the walls of Chepstow Castle. It was hidden on the right bank of the river and at high tide covered by several feet of water. He says that he honestly believes this to be the long sought cache.

Further census returns show that there are 1,178,317 females in excess of males in Great Britain. The figures, however, would be greatly reduced if the soldiers and sailors abroad were counted. Females continue to increase faster than males as they have consistently since 1821.

A unique display of diamonds loaned by the Debeers Company and valued at over \$10,000,000 was yesterday included among the exhibits of the Festival of Empire at Crystal Palace. This is the biggest exhibition of precious stones ever seen in England.

GAY AT BREAKFAST COLLAPSED ON GALLOWES

GODERICH, Ont., June 16—Edward Jardine was executed in the county jail at 8 o'clock this morning for the murder of Lizzie Anderson, a 16-year-old girl, on Sept. 26th, last. Jardine slept from 11 o'clock last night till 4 o'clock this morning, when he rose and swept out his cell and made his bed as usual. He then had breakfast and prepared for the hangman. Half an hour before the time set he broke down and had to be given a dose of morphine. He then walked to the gallows without any visible emotion. Press representatives were rigidly excluded, the only persons witnessing the execution being Sheriff Reynolds, Jailor Griff, Jail Surgeon Taylor, Warden Geiser, Rev. Mr. Ross, the condemned man's spiritual adviser, and two constables. Last night Jardine was baptised and then signed a statement prepared by the minister, in which he does not specifically admit the crime, but regrets his wayward life and asks forgiveness for his sins.


