ST. ANNE PRESBYTERY BURNED TO THE GROUND
DIGBY, N. S., Sept. 25.—A very destructive fire took place at Church Point last Monday afternoon when the St. Anne's Presbytery in connection with St. Ann's College was totally destroyed, entailing a loss of over \$20,000, of which there is an insurance about \$6,000. The origin of the fire fire is a mystery.

Killed at Mine

STELLARTON, September 27.—Charles Jewel, colored, of New Glasgow, was killed, and Edward Parris, of Stellarton, was seriously injured when a fall of coal in the Allan shaft mine here this morning buried both men. They were under the fall for two hours. Death came instantaneously to Jewel. Parris as soon as excavated, was rushed to the Aberdeen Hospital, where his injuries were said to be serious. They were at work in the mine at the time of the accident, and the fall came without warning of the danger of their position. Following the disaster the men abandoned work, but will resume tomorrow morning.
Mr. Jewel was thirty-six years of age, and is survived by his wife and five children. Parris is about thirty years of age and unmarried.

The congress having finished in Toronto last evening, the party leaves today for Niagara Falls, via St. Catharines.
