To Manufacture Smokeless Powder.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—The navy department expects to begin the manufacture of smokeless powder at its mills near Indian Head within the next two or three months. Work on the mills has been pushed energetically and at present about 1,200 men are employed. Altogether the buildings will number 23 or 25, with a capacity of 2,000 pounds of smokeless powder daily. This output seems large at first thought, but one of the big 18-inch guns or the Indiana uses 1,000 pounds of powder at a single shot.

THE NATION'S COAL.

British Battleships Wan Steam to be Utilized for Economy.

LONDON, Sept. 11.—A new departure of an important character has been decided upon by the Admiralty. As soon as the battleship Canopus, now being prepared for sea at Portsmouth, has completed her contractor's trials a large sum of money will be spent on altering her auxiliary machinery, so as to decrease her consumption of coal. The alteration will consist of so reconstructing the machinery that the exhaust steam from the main engines, instead of going back to water, will be utilized to work the vessel's evaporators.

This will be the first time that such an arrangement has been introduced into the machinery of a British battleship, although exhaust steam is already made use of in up-to-date merchant steamers. It is understood that this alteration will be extended to all battleships of the Canopus class.

SYDNEY, C. B., September 13.—The Peary Arctic Club's chartered steamer Diana arrived here this morning from Etæ, North Greenland, August 28, all well.

Peary and his two companions, with native allies were left in excellent health and spirits, comfortably housed for the winter, with provisions for two years, and an ample supply of dog food, 111 walrus having been killed since August 2nd for that purpose.

Peary will remain at Etæ until February, when, with a supporting party of natives, he will go to Fort Conger and thence begin his journey to the pole, either by the Greenland coast or from Cape Hecla, as conditions may be determined.
