When discovered it was found that surrounding the fire about the doors of the shed kerosene oil had been spread, old grass and paper piled up and all the necessary arrangements made for causing a quick blaze. The wind was blowing hard and everything was dry, a most favorable opportunity for the work of the treacherous perpetrator. Citizens were considerably relieved when hearing of the circumstances to know that the early discovery of the fire and the prompt action of those who were near prevented what might have proved a serious disaster to the community. As it was there was no damage, the doors being barely singed.
