Much is being said about getting people cut to vote. A much helpful thing would be a movement to have candidates discuss civic questions in a more informed and comprehensive way.

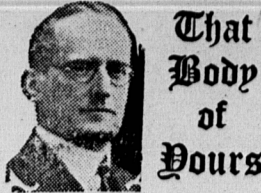
Trepan and Pilon, of Montreal began 20 year penitentiary sentences last week. These two cowardly thugs escaped a murder charge only because a revolver did not work.

OIL TREATMENT FOR GALL STONES

Although you do not hear as much about the 'oil' cure for gall stones as formerly, nevertheless, like many other things, there is some merit in the oil treatment.

The old idea that oil of various kinds would actually dissolve the gall stones is hardly true, but that the oil can actually help the removal of the stones is true.

Dr. G. Singer prescribes one or two tablespoonfuls of pure olive oil, in the morning on an empty stomach.

In order that oil may be taken more readily by individuals who do not like olive oil, the mouth is washed out with water containing a few drops of essence of peppermint.

As mentioned before the oil treatment for sluggish liver and gall stones is now more often given by the use of a tube, about the size of a slate pencil.

Most people keep free of gall stones by the use of butter or other fats in their ordinary meals, and by the usual bending or breathing exercises.
