They have considerable trouble with the sharks whom they use unmercifully when they get them in their power. Not much fishing off South Lake, or West River, but the fishermen go to the Point on the fine days. Nothing doing off Red Point or Little Harbour at present. Further west there is some hake but bait is scarce, the squid being hard to catch.—Farmers are ploughing and threshing; scarcely any produce is moving and shippers find it difficult to load the few vessels offering. The pork fever of a year ago has abated, other lines are found just as profitable, and less laborious. William Young, himself a veteran feeder, farmer and butcher has reduced his hogs far below last year's number.
