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**Papers Lead List On Montreal Stock Market Yesterday**

MONTREAL, July 2 — (CP)—Gains out-numbered losses nearly two to one in more livelier trading of the stock exchange and up to market today. Papers in particular were stronger with all of the more active ones registering gains.  
Closing averages of the Montreal Stock Exchange listed prices up 6.68 to 338.88. Industrials up 7 to 123.7, banks up 12 to 27.12, utilities off .1 to 76.7 and golds unchanged at 73.80. Volume of industrials was steady at 38,400 but trading in mining stock accelerated to 173,000.  
Price was the feature of the paper group up 1 1-4 at 62 3-4, while Fraser added a point at 50. M. and O. advanced half a point at 18, and International was up a similar amount at 50 1-2. Consolidated pushed ahead 5-8 at 17 5-8 and Abitibi rose 3-8 at 17 1-8. Brown active today, improved 1-8 at 4 5-8. Abitibi Pfd. and B. C. Forest closed unchanged at 21 and 3 1-2 respectively.  
In the industrials, Dosco "B" advanced almost a point at 14 1-2. General Bakeries rose 3-4 at 4 3-4 and Cub added 5 cents at 1.10. Southmount was unchanged at 40.  
The oils were exceptionally busy with 33,500 shares of Pacalta closing up 2 cents at 15 and 15,500 shares of Omnitran closing up 7-8 of a cent at 19 7-8. Calgary and Edmonton touched a new high of 2.60 up 15 cents and Home added 26 cents at 4.70. McColl advanced 1-2 at 30. International Petroleum closed at 12 7-8 unchanged and Homestead did likewise at 54.  
Canadian Breweries added 1-4 in shares of 24 1-2 and Waters added the same fraction at 22 3-4. 1,075 shares of Distillers Seagrams closed off 1-8 at 17. In utilities International was 7-8 better at 12. Brazilian 1-4 at 21 3-4 and Shawinigan 1-4 at 22 3-4. C. P. R. was up 1-4 at 13 1-4 in currency.  
In the metal section Consolidated Smelting was ahead a point and a half at 84 and International Nickel improved 1-4 at 34 1-4. In mines, 46,500 shares of Pitt closed up 1-2 cent at 15 1-2 while Sherwin-Gordon added 15 cents at 3.30. MacDonald led 5 at 3.25 and Cons Central Cadillac was off 1-4 at 38 3-4.

**Price Trend On N. Y. Exchange Varied Yesterday**

NEW YORK, July 2—(AP)—Mild reinvestment demand and a little further covering by shorts gave 250 up 15 cents selected bills, rail and industrials in today's stock market, a number touching highs for the year, but enough customers cashed in on Tuesday's substantial upswing to put many leaders in the casualty division.  
Dealing in the first three hours, tapered as initial gains running to 3 or more points were reduced or cancelled. While relatively strong spots persisted at the close pivoted losers of fractions to a point or so were plentiful. Transfers of 1,180,000 shares compared with 1,900,000 the day before and were the largest since June 11.  
The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 1 of a point at 65 4 a high since April 2.  
Among Canadian issues, Canadian Pacific remained unchanged. Dome Mines was off 1-4. Distillers Seagrams lost an early fractional gain to close off 3-8. On the curb, Lake Shore gained 1-4.  
Registering gains in 1947 were Superior Oil which ended up 2 1-2 at 116 1-2; Phillips Petroleum 1-2 at 60 3-4. Standard Oil of Cal 1-2 at 61 3-4. Gulf Oil 1-2 at 69. Nickel Plate Preferred 1 1-4 at 112 1-4 and United Fruit 5-8 at 52 7-8. At the years peak at one time but finishing with minor declines were Standard Oil (NJ), Pur Oil, Ohio Oil and Joy Mfg. Union Pacific was up 3 at 137. Santa Fe 2 1-8 at 82 7-8. Nickel Plate Common 1-7-8 at 35 1-2. Wayne Pump 2 1-4 at 34 1-4. and Owens Illinois 1 3-4 at 72 1-4.  
Ahead were Republic Steel, Goodrich, U. S. Rubber, Cesterhill Tractor, Consolidated Edison, Electric Power and Light, American Water Works, American Can, Du Pont, Philip Morris, Panhandle Producing, N. Y. Central, Pennsylvania Railroad, Southern Pacific Southern Railway, Northern Pacific and Great Northern Railway.  
American Smelting yielded 1 7-8 at 58 1-2 and U. S. Gypsum 1 at 108. Lesser recessions were shown
