Radioactive Clouds Seen New Weapon

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21. (AP) — Despite unofficial talk of new atomic bombs and possibilities of developing other forms of atomic warfare, the official word on the subject—two years after Hiroshima—is still this: The United States can manufacture atomic bombs. It still is working on the military application of atomic energy. It is carrying on research and development work on improved atomic weapons.

New Experiments
Glen Martin, airplane manufacturer, referred to work on a "radioactive cloud" while addressing a Senate commerce sub-committee.

Such weapons might make use of the radioactive effects of particles (containing radioactivity) dispersed by means other than an explosion, thus providing the radioactive effects without the accompanying blast and heat effects.

Such a concept was outlined in an Associated Press interview by experts who said that the advantage of such a technique—if demonstrated—would be that a city far inland could be drenched with radioactivity without an exploding atomic bomb in the area.

Dr. Edward Teller, one of the scientists who worked on the A-bomb, believes that future atomic bombs may be 1,000 times more powerful than those used on Japan. He set forth such a belief in the Bulletin of the Atomic Scientists.

New Light Shed On Temple Ruins 6,000 Years Old

BAGHDAD, Aug. 21. (CP) — The sandy wastes of southern Iraq, where evidence of the biblical flood was reported found in 1929, have now revealed ruins indicating to the Iraqi antiquities department that the ancient Babylonians knew a good deal about architecture and religious ritual nearly 6,000 years ago.

Excavators working under the direction of Sir Leonard Woolley found the temple at Eridu beneath the foundations of a colossal tower built by two kings of the third dynasty of Ur.

After his excavations at Ur, Sir Leonard believed that these older inhabitants had been driven in their mult-hut villages by the great flood; but that some of the Sumerians, who he thought had come into the country and built their cities or high mounds with walls of burnt brick, had survived to develop their great civilization.

That disturbing total, only a bare 88,700,000 away from the adverse balance for the whole of 1946, lent renewed confirmation to predictions that the disparity would reach \$200,000,000 by the end of this year and underlined the need for steps to build up the dollar reserve to right the imbalance.

The Experts Say

OTTAWA, Aug. 22. (CP) — If she has half a dozen eggs in the cupboard any wife housewife need never be stumped when she comes to plan a meal.

Spanish Omelet. Ingredients: 1-2 tablespoons glutinous rice; one-quarter cup cold water; three egg yolks; one-quarter teaspoon salt; 2-4 cups milk; one teaspoon vanilla; three egg whites; one-third cup sugar.

Beat eggs slightly, add milk and seasoning and pour over the bread. Cover and keep in the ice box until firm. Over-cook in a moderate oven until set—about 45 minutes (if thoroughly chilled before baking the puff will puff up like a soufflé).

Budget Omelet. Ingredients: 1-2 cups soft bread crumbs; 1-2 cups milk; six eggs, separated; salt; pepper.

Mix crumbs and milk, let soak, then beat smooth. Beat egg yolks, add salt and pepper and combine with bread mixture. Beat whites stiff and fold into mixture. Pour into hot greased pan and cook slowly until firm, 25 to 30 minutes. Cook in a slow oven for the last 10 minutes if desired, to brown the top. The same mixture may be cooked as scrambled eggs. Five to six servings.

Variation — 1; Add chopped parsley, green onions and diced celery to mixture before cooking. 2; When cooked, spread omelet with jam or jelly, fold over and serve at once. 3; Add finely chopped, cooked vegetables or grated raw carrots to mixture before cooking.
