**Presented With Imp. Service Medal**

From the number of cars parked around the residence of William McDonald, former light house keeper at West Point, it looked as if all roads led to this spot on the evening of Wednesday, the 27th. The occasion was the presentation to Mr. McDonald of an Imperial Service Medal granted to him for long and faithful service in the government employ.

It was plainly evident from the spirit of the gathering that Mr. MacDonald is a general favorite among all classes; one of nature's noblemen, whom the people delighted to honor.

Speeches were made by the following gentlemen:—Mr. W. H. Dennis, M. L. A., Mr. Wortman, Mr. David Stewart and Mr. George Sheen, all bearing testimony to Mr. MacDonald's faithfulness in the discharge of every duty and to the great hospitality of his home to all in the many years he had lived in their midst.

Music was furnished by several ladies of the community. The ice-cream was delicious, the real home made creamery kind and due praise must be given to the men who assisted in preparing same.

The hearty congratulations extended to Mr. MacDonald as the crowd pressed around him eager to shake his hand bore further testimony to his popularity.

After a social hour that was enjoyed to the full, further speeches were made and the meeting was brought to a close by the singing of the National Anthem.
