THE PREMIER presented certain returns asked for before by Mr. Mathieson.

THE SPEAKER read an invitation to the members to attend the meeting of the Anti-Tuberculosis Society in St. Paul's Schoolroom on Thursday evening next at 8 o'clock.

MR. ARSENAULT moved the House into committee on the bill to incorporate the Tignish Trading Company, Mr. McKinnon in the chair.

HON. L. McDONALD resumed the debate on the budget. He defended the Cold Storage Company and affirmed that the roads are in as good condition as they ever were.

MR. PROWSE followed commenting upon the bitter disappointment the budget speech must have been to the Premier's supporters.

\$10,000 more subsidy from Ottawa, which balanced the loss of \$10,000 in interest. Also that the withdrawal was approved by the Legislative Council which had a Liberal majority, and he quoted the late Premier, Parguharson as approving the principle of paying off the debt in this way.

Mr. Prowse reviewed the finances of the Province in its relations with the Dominion from consideration to the present time and strongly arraigned the Government for wasteful expenditure, for failure to fulfil their pledges, and for making expenditures like that on Government House without a vote of the Legislature authorizing it.

RESOLVED that this House affirms it absolute right to give or withhold supplies for the public service and that the expenditures made without such authority are unconstitutional and contrary to the rights of the people as secured under responsible government.

FURTHER RESOLVED that in the opinion of this House the practice of paying accounts from one fiscal year to another is calculated to lead to confusion, extravagance and corruption.

AND FURTHER RESOLVED that this House views with alarm the continually recurring deficits, and condemn the avowed policy of the Government to issue further debentures to meet the requirements of the public service.
