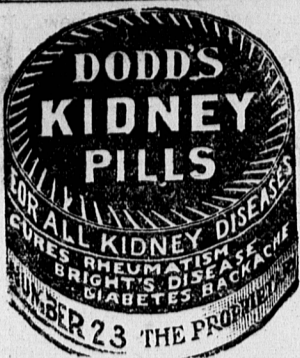


TERRIBLE ACCIDENT REPORTED.

NO PRETEXT FOR FURTHER DELAY.

There can be no reasonable pretext found for further delay in appointing a Judge and a Senator for Prince Edward Island. The late lamented Senator Ferguson died in September, 1909. He was one of the ablest public men the Province has produced.

The strong words used recently by Premier Hazard in regard to our representation fairly represent the opinions of the people of both parties on his question. It is "a swindle" to deny us our full rights of representation at Ottawa.

The vacant judgeship affords an almost equally strong ground of complaint. During two years past the illness of one of our esteemed Judges has paralysed the Court of Appeal of this Province, and devolved upon the two remaining Judges the work of three. This is most unfair and unjust to them; it is a great wrong to litigants whose appeals are stayed, and to others whose cases must be re-tried when the vacancy is filled, but who are kept waiting for months and years upon the Government's inaction.

We appeal to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who we think would like to follow and maintain the best traditions of

the Liberal party, to end these unseemly and injurious conditions. There are good, capable men at the Bar, who can be called to the Bench. There are not wanting fit men to be called to the Senate, whether it be policy of the Government to further increase their three-fourths party membership in that body, or to admit a Conservative or an Independent. It is not just, or statesmanlike, or even good politics, to keep these places vacant, these offices dangling. That way lies political weakness and loss from growing popular dissatisfaction, already deeply aroused. Every day's delay but serves to aggravate the situation.

Very regrettably, there seems to have been no farmers from Prince Edward Island among the big delegation of farmers to Ottawa.

A western newspaper points out that a large majority of the newspapers of Canada are controlled by the manufacturers. That is why they are opposed to tariff reduction, or silent on the subject. The Guardian is not thus controlled and has no other end to serve than the best welfare of the people.

The esteemed Examiner cannot see why, if reduced duty sometimes produces more revenue than a high duty, the people would be benefited. They would pay more taxes, it says, in such case. True, oh King! They would pay more taxes in the aggregate, but would get back the money so paid, and much more by the reduced prices of farm implements and machinery, cottons, woollens and other goods. And not only would the people gain, but the treasury would gain by receiving so much of the money now paid as a forced levy by consumers to the manufacturers. Those 1,200 farmer delegates at Ottawa surely know what is for their good.

Great importance attaches to keeping the Government steamer Minto on the Summerside Tormentine route until the fall produce awaiting shipment to the mainland can be taken across the Straits. In recent years the steamer has been sometimes snatched away from the western route after but two or three trips, while freight was still awaiting transportation there and when no exigencies of weather or ice conditions demanded the change, and the change was made without notice to shippers. The Marine Department seems now disposed to accede to the reasonable desires of western shippers, and we trust the Minto will be kept on that route as long as may be necessary.

Public Notice

As measles seem to be getting prevalent in the schools of Charlottetown owing to the neglect of some citizens, public notice is called to the Regulations of the Board of Health, especially to Rules 1 and 6. Rule 1 states that any household in whose house occurs a case of measles shall immediately notify the Board of Health, through its Health Officer or secretary, of the same. Rule 6 states that no member of any household where measles exists shall be permitted to mingle with children in schools, churches, or other public places. There is a penalty of \$40.00 for failure to obey the rules. The Board of Health requests all citizens to comply with the regulations at once, and assist in stamping out the disease. W. W. 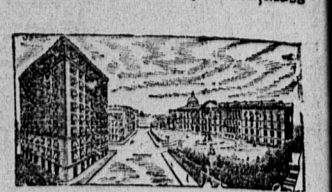
