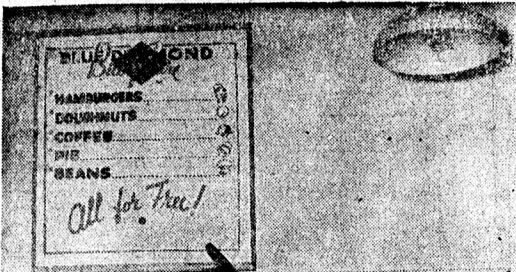

Stock Markets At A Glance

TORONTO, Feb. 4 — (CP) — The gold stocks changed hands in heavy volume on moderate price gains in Saturday's Market. A few posted wide gains. Trading expanded in the Western Oil list and this group led the advance with an index gain of .86. Golds added 38 the industrials 07 and the Base Metals took a small index loss.

WINNIPEG, Feb. 4 — (CP) — Rye futures closed 1 3/8 to 1 1/8 cent a bushel higher Saturday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with May at \$1.26.

News seasonal highs were posted in all three deliveries. Upturns were attributed to good outside buyers. No export business was reported.

CHICAGO, Feb. 4 — (AP) — Grain futures were steady to firm Saturday with most of the support provided by short covering and professional buying but the trade was extremely quiet and most price changes were limited to a range of less than a cent.

NEW YORK, Feb. 4 — (AP) — Scattered steels, rails, motors and industrials made further progress in Saturday's Stock Market, after a good average week, but many leaders had to contend with profit cashing on Friday's upswing.

The Associated Press 60-Stock composite was up .1 of a point at 96.5 and on the week showed a net gain of 5. The utility average went into new high ground since 1940 by 1. Transfers of 1,054,800 shares compared with 743,300 the previous Saturday.

MONTREAL, Feb. 4 — (CP) — Trading on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market at the end of last week appeared to be struggling up from the levels to which many pivotal issues slipped in continuation of the previous week's shallow slope toward lower ground. Market students suggested doubts about the effect of post-war adjustments on industry, to which was added uncertainty on the Canadian political situation, might be having a lessened influence on investment sentiment.

N. S. Beer Quota To Be Increased
(By The Canadian Press)
HALIFAX, Feb. 2—Effective Feb. 5, the province's beer quota of two dozen quarts a month will be increased to three, the Nova Scotia Liquor Commission announced today.

There is no change in the hard liquor and wine ration of one quart of spirits or two quarts of imported wine, or four quarts of Canadian wine.
