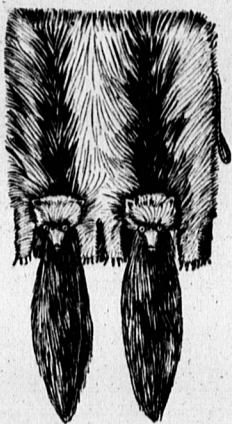

LIVERPOOL AND THE SCHOOL OF SCIENCE

(Continued from page 1.) THE SUMMER SCHOOL OF SCIENCE MEETS AT LIVERPOOL.

No such opportunity for having a good time and for intellectual improvement has been presented before. Through the influence of Mayor Mulhall, militia tents have been secured for those who prefer out-door life. These tents will hold parties up to six in number. A large dining tent will be erected by the Town Committee, and there the faculty and citizens will meet the students, ensuring acquaintance and agreeable social intercourse. Life in camp will be like that enjoyed by the Appalachian Mountain Club and other large organizations, whose members desire to live the simple life in summer. An early application to Mayor Mulhall will secure tents for those who wish them. These will be particularly desirable for those who take military drill, (which is to be a feature of the school this year,) because the tents will be pitched beside the drill grounds. The citizens can accommodate more than a hundred in their homes.

Students at the School will acquire a broad acquaintance with their co-workers. They will meet and hear men prominent in provincial affairs. Several officials of high rank have already signified their intention of visiting the School and other large ones have been invited. Teachers are not the only ones, whom the School will welcome. Anyone interested in science at first hand, or attracted by an interest in educational matters will be cordially received.

The outing can be taken at small cost. It need not be more than twenty-five dollars. Return tickets will probably be one fare. Board will cost from five to seven dollars per week. It is possible that some students may win scholarships, which will pay almost their entire outlay for the three weeks. Realizing that the small salary of teachers makes it very difficult for some to take advantage of the benefits the School offers, members of the faculty and public spirited citizens have offered the following sums of money to be awarded to the students standing highest in the closing examinations, the test questions to be confined absolutely to what is taught in the School during the session.

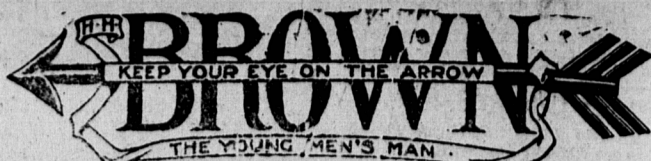
