AMERICAN SEEKS HER DAUGHTER

Mrs. Emerson in London to See Imprisoned Suffragette

LONDON, April 1 (Special)—Mrs. Emerson, of Detroit, Mich., who came to London because of the imprisonment of her daughter, Miss Zelle Emerson, a suffragette, was refused permission by the prison authorities to see her daughter.

Miss Zelle Emerson was sentenced along with Miss Sylvia Pankhurst to serve a two months' term for window smashing. Both of them went on hunger strike. Miss Pankhurst was released a few days ago "on medical grounds." In a statement which she issued Miss Emerson, after describing her own sufferings, declared that Miss Emerson was practically a physical wreck.

Mrs. Emerson says that she has received trustworthy information that her daughter has been so cruelly treated that her body is covered with bruises.

Miss Scott-Troy, of San Francisco, announced that she would head a deputation of American women to accompany Mrs. Emerson to the American Embassy to demand the embassy's intervention in behalf of the young woman.
