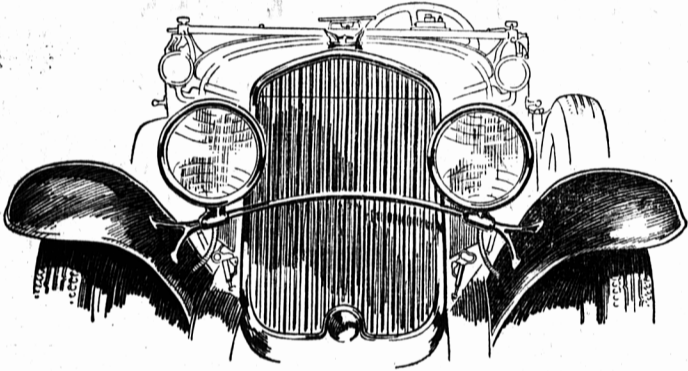

**Cane Chair**
