While I pen this report I have a letter from our Grand Worthly Patriarch in which he formulates methods of work for the coming summer, which if brought into operation will greatly increase the interest in our divisions I might just add here that this Grand Division will owe Bro. Small a large debt of gratitude for his indefatigable efforts in bringing up this Grand Division to its present state of efficiency. It gives your Grand Secy great encouragement to work in conjunction with such a leader. Bro. Small is unquestionably the most zealous and alert temperance worker in the Grand Division of P. E. I. today, which is making no "Small" statement. On Thursday Feb. 14th the Prince Co Temperance Alliance was held in S. Side when the following resolution was passed: Whereas the appointments of vendors in S. Side is in direct opposition to the Temperance sentiment of the said county, and whereas their business as vendors has had a detrimental effect upon the spirit of the Prohibition Law as it was intended, we, the Temperance Alliance do strongly disapprove of them, and ask the government not to appoint or renew license of the now present vendors, or any others. We highly commend the work of the Temperance Alliance and do think that it should receive once a substantial support from this Grand Division as we consider its influence to be most valuable in securing temperance legislation for this province. We are pleased to learn that our friend and Bro. Rev. A. D. McDonald has given his services to the Temperance Association of Alberta as organizer at a salary of \$2000 and expenses per year. Bro. McDonald will doubtless prove a worthy pioneer in that Western section.
