### Value of Selection Of Seed Potatoes

(Experimental Farms Note) During recent years virus diseases have been given much attention and it has been found that the best way to eliminate them from the potato crops is to select healthy plants for seed purposes during the growing season. In this manner, the yield per acre has been increased and the type and quality of the potatoes have been improved. Several years ago, a system of seed potato certification was organized by the Division of Botany, of the Dominion Experimental Farms and is now conducted in every province of Canada. Before crops are certified they must pass careful inspections of the plants and of the tubers. The most important of these inspections is that given to the plants during the growing season.

Only those crops that conform to rigid standards, in regard to freedom from disease and purity of variety, are certified for seed purposes. In this manner seed potatoes of very high standard are made available to potato growers. In order to maintain high standards of seed, the growers have found it advisable to make careful selections each year of the healthy good type plants for their foundation stock. Before they dig the main crop, they carefully harvest the tubers from the most desirable plants. If any of these plants do not conform to the required standards in yield, type, etc., they are discarded. The selected tubers are given the best storage available. In planting these in the seed plot, advanced growers generally use the "tuber unit" method, by which all the seed pieces from any one tuber are planted in sequence. This method assists greatly in more efficient roguing and in making better selections of the healthy plants. If the plant from one seed piece of any tuber does not conform to the required standards in freedom from disease, type, etc., every plant from that tuber is rogued out and discarded.

The selection of plants and of tubers has been conducted, according to this method, by the Dominion Seed Potato Certification Service in British Columbia. The results obtained with several varieties, have demonstrated that a worthwhile increase in yield is obtained by proper selections of plants and of tubers for seed purposes. As a result of the selection of plants and tubers over a three-year period, with thirty samples received from growers for testing in the experimental plot, the average yield was increased by one and a half tons per acre. In selecting, the grower should become familiar with the best type of plants, as well as of the tuber, of the variety he is growing. By continually selecting this most desirable type he will eventually develop a good uniform strain. This is undoubtedly the best method of maintaining a high standard of seed potatoes.

### Every Woman Wore An Easter Bonnet

LONDON, Ont., April 24—(O.P.)—"Bonnets were worn by both old and young. Even children wore bonnets," says Mrs. William McLeod, aged 84, referring to one of black velvet trimmed with pink ribbon, which she donned on Easter Day some scores of years ago, while her sister was proud of one fashioned of red velvet and trimmed with

white satin ribbon. The Easter outfit was not given much thought in those days, however. As an infant, Mrs. McLeod came with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Michael Coughlan, from England in 1861, six weeks being taken for the voyage. In these far-off days the girls wore dresses of woollen and calico materials. Mrs. McLeod's mother, however, had brought with her from England, several silk gowns, elaborately designed, and these served her well in the new land where rich materials were rare indeed. Tea was not for everyone then, as it cost \$1 a pound. In England the rector's wife in one parish used to leave the tea-leaves from each brewing outside in a covered dish, to be removed by those who did not mind a weaker drink. North London was a commons and little did the Coughlan children realize that this part of the town was destined to become one

of the finest residential districts of Ontario. Every Londoner, at this time, owned a garden, and during the summer months the women and children spent many hours picking red and black currants and the wild raspberries along the fences of London North. The old school was a two-room building with a gallery, the latter being used by the sewing class.
