OPENING OF LOBSTER SEASON - It has been learned from the Regional Fishery office here that an amendment has been made to Orders-in-Council P. C. 5360 of Dec. 31, 1947 which reads as follows: "No one shall leave the shore for the fishing grounds with buoys, anchors, lines or other lobster fishing gear, nor shall anyone place or set such gear in any lobster fishing district as specified in these regulations before the opening day for fishing in such district." The opening date for this season will be after 12 o'clock midnight, April 30th.
