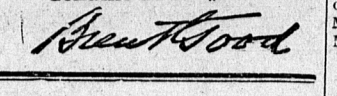

SYDNEY, June 27.—The customs authorities at this port have held up a fine herd of cattle, consigned to the Cross Fertilizer company, which arrived via the S. S. Inishowenhead, from Glasgow, this not being a quarantine port. The herd will be sent to Quebec, and after passing inspection will be brought back for the Cross Fertilizer company's experimental farm. The herd comprises one cow, two heifers and one bull of fine Ayshire pedigree bred from the stock farm of Alexander Cross, at Maypoole, Ayshire, Scotland. They will be placed on the company's farm at this place for stocking purposes, and for the purpose of improving stock generally in the island of Cape Breton.

A FIGHT FOR MILLIONS

LONDON, June 27.—The "fight for the millions" was continued in the law courts to-day in the suit brought by the family of the late Sir John Murray Scott, to declare invalid the will by which he left Lady Sackville, a relative of a former British minister at Washington nearly \$5,000,000 and other property.

Walter Scott, a brother of the dead millionaire, who secured his title by inducing Sir Richard Wallace to give his priceless art collection to the British nation, was called to the witness stand to-day and cross-examined by Sir Edward Carson. He testified that the Scott family did not suggest there had been any undue relations between Sir John and Lady Sackville.
