THE ANGLO-JAPANESE ALLIANCE.

The exact terms of the Anglo-Japanese alliance agreed upon early in 1902 and in force as affecting the present war situation are as follows:

"If either power becomes involved in war the other high contracting party will preserve strict neutrality and use its efforts to prevent other powers joining in hostilities.

"If any other power or powers should join the enemy against the ally the other high contracting party will go to its assistance, and will conduct war in common and make peace in loyal agreement with the ally.

"Neither ally without consulting the other shall enter into a separate arrangement with another power to its ally's prejudice.

"When either party's interests are jeopardized the two Governments will communicate with each other fully and frankly."

It is to be observed that this treaty was made after it had become probable that war would break out between Japan and Russia at an early date. Its primary object was to prevent any other power interfering and to secure to Japan a fair field in the struggle and prevent other nations becoming involved.

Britain stands as arbiter of the impending struggle. She says to all other powers: "If you assist Russia against Japan then you have to fight me. But if you preserve a strict neutrality between the combatants I will do the same."

If Japan is worsted in the struggle with Russia alone Britain will not interfere. If Russia is worsted in the fight France or Germany cannot go to the rescue without the certainty of having to fight Britain as well as Japan.

THE CASE OF DIGBY.

The Town of Digby in the County of Digby desired to have its port equipped with a deep water wharf and other terminal facilities, and in aid of an expected Government grant toward that object decided to enter into an agreement with Albert James Smith Copp, M. P. the Liberal representative of the County, and appropriated the sum of \$5,000 from the Town funds. That was a year ago in November last. Of this sum \$500 was advanced to Mr. Copp as expenses. And there for a year Digby rested its case. There is nothing to show that Mr. Copp failed to do what he could to secure a Government grant. The facts that impress the Town Council are that Digby is still without its wharf and is otherwise out \$500, and like a certain Senator in the West Digby "cannot wait." When last heard from the Digby Council was considering a resolution setting forth that:

"Whereas on the 27th of November, 1902, a resolution was adopted by the town council of the town of Digby authorizing the mayor to enter into an agreement and contract with A. J. S. Copp, M. P., for payment to the said A. J. S. Copp of the sum of \$5,000 for securing approved wharf accommodation at the port of Digby, and on the 29th of November, 1902, an agreement and contract were entered into under the said resolution, and the sum of \$500, a portion of the said \$5,000 was paid to the said A. J. S. Copp on account of expenses, it is desirable that the said resolution be re-considered and the agreement canceled and annulled."

Mr. Copp is also asked to refund the \$500.
