LONDON, Feb. 2.—The Baroness Burdett-Coutts, one of the foremost of Englishwomen, a philanthropist, and an intimate friend of the late Queen Victoria, is seriously ill. The Baroness, who is ninety-two years old, created a considerable sensation twenty-five years ago, by marrying a young diplomat, a brother of the late E. Ashmead Bartlett, M.P. The union proved a happy one. The husband, who was quite poor and who later took the name of Burdett-Coutts, is still alive.

THE EARLY DAYS OF THE WILD WEST

P. W. Ings, of Calgary, is at the Royal. He is an extensive rancher and has from 500 to 600 head of horses and as many cattle on his place. He has been in the west twenty-five years and has grown up and prospered with the country.

Now, however, all is changed. The old days were the days of wild picturesque characters. A man had to be courageous to live in the west at all, and to gain a living meant a good deal more than people in the east can imagine.

Mr. Ings, among others, has a warm recollection of Rev. Henry Irvine, known all over Alberta as Father Pat, a typical frontier preacher. He had been reared in affluence and refinement, but during the losses had driven him into the wild, and he had found there his life work.

As Mr. Ings described him there was very little of the cleric in his appearance. Sometimes he was to be seen in broad cloth, but more commonly in overalls. He had thoroughly entered into the life of the men around him. He never spared himself, but would ride for miles over the roughest trails to visit a sick miner or rancher.

He died in Montreal, to which city he had gone to undergo an operation.

A body of iron of whom Mr. Ings speaks highly is the Northwest Mounted Police. He has great admiration for their courage and has many stories of them to tell. Mr. Ings is pleased with St. John. He will leave in a short time for Chicago and home.—St. John Telegraph.

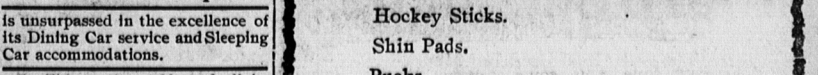
