LEGISLATION IN JULY.

Ottawa is a good place in spring and fall, healthful and bracing but cold in winter and almost intolerably hot in midsummer.

Before 1896 the session was very rarely thus extended to midsummer. In thirty years it only occurred five times.

Some years ago the ending of the fiscal year was moved backward from 30th June to 31st March in order to facilitate the laying of departmental reports before Parliament and in order that the sessions might begin and end earlier than before.

What is the matter? Have our public men lost their old-time grip on national affairs? Has Parliament settled down to a policy of drift instead of resolute action? The existing conditions are deplorable. Each party blames the other for bringing about these conditions.

It turned out that while Prof. Bell was in Charlottetown for the first time the aeroplane in which he is so largely interested won the Scientific American's prize at Hammondsport, N.Y. against all competitors.
