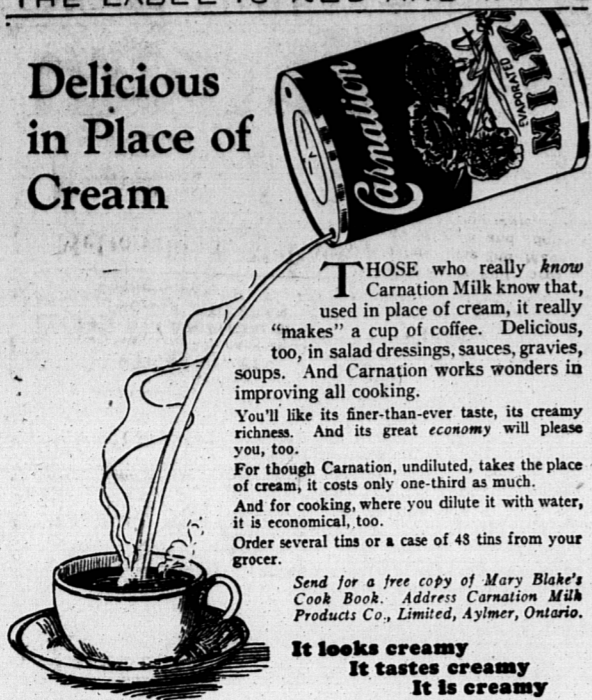

utterly incapable of changing their diet, their raiment, or their place of worship without first getting an Act of Parliament passed. Then they want to force everybody else in the world to follow them. It would be amusing if it were not so demoralizing, destructive and devastating, religiously as well as politically.

One of the minor evils of prohibition is the political hypocrisy that it produces or that produces it—I do not know which. Prohibitionist propagandists who support the principles in which they profess to believe in preference to their favorite political party are rare birds indeed. In Ontario, prohibition was enacted by the Hearst, Conservative government, but when the election came "round, the grit prohibitionists voted and worked grit as usual and succeeded in defeating their best friends. Then Ontario was inflicted with a U. F. O. government and while the leaders of that government were proclaiming from the housetops their adherence to prohibition, whiskey was bootlegged right into the Parliament buildings and consumed at parties in some of the cabinet minister's rooms.

Another peculiar fact is the attitude and conduct of a certain type of political person. At the time of writing the Rev. Dr. Murdoch MacKinnon is campaigning for the Grit-prohibitionist forces in P. E. Island, evidently imported for that purpose. Dr. MacKinnon was in Regina Saskatchewan, when the Liberal government of that province held a referendum and repealed prohibition there, but he did not take an active part in the campaign against the Liberal government of Saskatchewan or the Liberal government-control Liquor Law which was adopted. Dr. MacKinnon came to Runnymede United Church in the suburbs of Toronto, last year. He was only here a few weeks before the provincial election in Ontario, but he managed to find time to speak in quite a number of places against the Conservative Government and Conservative Government Control measure here. Now he goes nearly half way across the continent to oppose a Conservative Government in Prince Edward Island, while his congregation innocently believes that he is enjoying a well-earned holiday in the Maritimes. It is amazing.

People cannot be made good by legislation. It is time to get back again to more excellent and more effective way—personal regeneration. It is time to separate church and state again in this country and turn right about face and get back to sound doctrine and sane politics. That is what is happening in all the Provinces. P. E. I. will surely keep in step.
