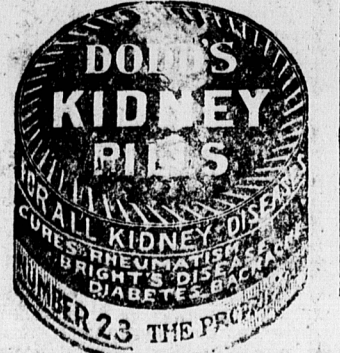

Hearst, minister of lands, forest and mines for the province of Ontario, extended a welcome to the members of the Canadian Mining Institute at the opening session of its 14th annual meeting this morning at the King Edward hotel. In doing so, he promised the hearty co-operation of his department and of the government with work of the institute. The mining industry of Canada, he said, formed one of the Dominion's greatest sources of revenue. President Dr. Frank D. Adams, in his annual address, stated that the institute membership had increased from 857 to 950 in the past year. His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught wrote regretting his inability to attend. The secretary read the report from Nova Scotia, showing that there are 15,500 employed in the collieries of that province and that there were 139 accidents, of which 36 were fatal. This was one fatal accident for every 172,000 tons of coal mined. The total amount of coal mined was 6,192,000 tons. Dr. Porter, of McGill university, Montreal, moved that the Dominion government be asked to admit rescue apparatus used in mines free of duty. The motion was seconded by B. E. Jacobs, of Victoria, B. C., and passed unanimously. ...ALBERT COUNTY MAN MAY LOSE SIGHT OF EYE. HOPEWELL HILL, March 5--Hugh Tucker, a young man living a few miles from here, met with a bad accident a day or two ago which caused serious injury to his eyes. The young man was running in the woods and fired at a rabbit, when the breach of the gun blew open and the powder from the shell was driven violently into the young fellow's eyes, blinding him so that he had to be led out of the woods by a younger brother, who was with him. One of the eyes had come pretty nearly all right, but the other is in a serious condition, although the doctor who was called today has hopes that the sight may be restored with good care.

GENERAL ANDRADE KILLED BY HIS MEN.

GUAYAQUIL, Ecuador, March 6--General Julio Andrade, the military commander at Guayaquil, was assassinated at Quito last night by some of his soldiers. General Andrade was the chief figure in the suppression of the recent revolution in Ecuador after the death of President Estrada.

BRANDT BEFORE GRAND JURORS

NEW YORK, March 6--Foulke E. Brandt, the Schiff valet, alleged victim of a conspiracy to keep him in prison for thirty years, is expected to testify before the Grand Jury today. Brandt will tell all the details of the plot in which he says he was snared--the circumstances surrounding his employment in the household of Mortimer L. Schiff, his dismissal, his visit to the Schiff house the night he is charged with having gone as a burglar, his encounter with Schiff, the twenty-minute conversation between Schiff and Brandt, his visit to the Schiff office on Schiff's invitation, his examination by alienists, his arrest, the alleged promise by Schiff attorneys that if he pleaded guilty he would get one year and a large sum of money, his conviction and sentence and finally the watch placed upon him in prison to check all his efforts to regain freedom.
