HORRIBLE CRIME COMMITTED

VANCOUVER, B. C., April 6.—That Mrs. Charles J. Millard was murdered and her body burned in the furnace of her home is the belief of police officials who have been inquiring into the circumstances of her disappearance on Wednesday last. Jack Kong, a Chinese boy 17 years old, is being detained as a result of the evidence, which the police have obtained from the ashes of the furnace. What has the appearance of human bones and rings was found when they made an examination last night. Bloodhounds which the department brought from the provincial penitentiary at New Westminster took up the scent from traces of a stain, which had been found in a rug on the dining room floor, following it to the cellar and pointing to an axe. Later they led the detectives to the attic where the clothes had been found earlier in the day.

CANADA'S GROWTH IN REAL ESTATE

(Canadian Press.) LONDON—Gazette Cable, April 8.—Jos. Martin, M. P., for St. Francois, London, interviewed on his several months tour of Canada, expressed the opinion that some cities west have grown too at while the immense expenditure in building the two transcontinental railways has largely been the cause of an unhealthy real estate boom, nevertheless with Canada's substantial natural resources there is every reason to expect the country will regain its good condition. He believed the British investor is taking a safe course in lending money to the Dominion.

AMHERST MAN WINS THE ROAD RACE.

AMHERST, April 6.—James Easton, the well known Amherst distance runner, defeated Victor MacAulay, Windsor, the winner of the last Herald and Mail road race and W. C. Chambers, of St. John, in the Maritime Winter Fair building this evening. Rogers of Halifax and Turnbull of Springhill, were entered but failed to make an appearance. MacAulay was forced to leave the track at the end of the fourth mile as he wrenched a tendon in the heel of his right foot. This accident will prevent him from taking part in the Boston Marathon on the twentieth of this month. With MacAulay out of the race, Easton found no great difficulty in winning, as at the time of the accident he and MacAulay had two laps on the St. John man. Easton increased his lead to four laps and romped home an easy winner in the time of 58 minutes and 53 seconds.

EMIGRATION TRAFFIC.

LONDON, April 6.—According to the Vienna correspondent of the Telegraph, the Austrian Ministry of Commerce has concluded long negotiations with the Austro-American, North German, Lloyd and Hamburg-American lines for the regulation of emigrant traffic. The chief point of the negotiations is the greater participation of Trieste in the North American emigrant traffic, and also the securing of control over the traffic in order to prevent emigrants liable to military service from leaving the country. The new organization will probably be extended to other foreign countries by Austria.
