PHILADELPHIA, December 31.—August Delcourt, 64 years old, a veteran of the Franco-Prussian war, finds it not good to be alone—long. Accordingly, when his third wife died two months ago, he set himself to search for Mrs. Delcourt No. 4 and found her when he met seventeen-year-old Mary DeCamp, of No. 2101 East Poppleton street. Christmas eve they were married, and the pair began their honeymoon at the Christmas feast and family reunion of Mr. and Mrs. Louis DeCamp, the bride's parents. "This is the happiest Christmas of my life," said Mrs. Delcourt blushing. "It is so nice to be married to a man as good as my husband. We are going next week to Atco, N. J., where we have a nice big farm." Delcourt came to this country twenty-two years ago. In his younger days he fought under Garibaldi in Italy, and during the unpleasantness between the French and Germans he was a soldier in the army of Napoleon III.

### SAYS STRATHCONA CAN HAVE A LIFE BILLET

MONTREAL, Dec. 30.—Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux was in the city yesterday for the first time since his return from England, and took advantage of the occasion to give a sympathetic denial to the rumors that have been circulating through the press to the effect that Lord Strathcona intends resigning from the Canadian high commissionership in England. "There is not the slightest foundation for these stories," said Mr. Lemieux. "Lord Strathcona will if he so desires remain in England as Canada's high commissioner and honored representative, so long as there is breath in his body, and we hope he will be spared many years to do credit to the dominion at the heart of the empire." The story had been widely circulated north in Canada as well as in the United States, that Lord Strathcona was shortly to retire, and that the succession to the high commissionership had been offered to Sir H. Montague Allan, of Montreal.

### SEVERE SNOWSTORM IN GREAT BRITAIN

LONDON, Dec. 31.—The British Isles are experiencing a severe snow storm. In Scotland the train service is tied up and many factories have closed down. In several English counties roads are blocked with snow drifts. In London a fine snow is falling.

### RACERS ARE STILL IN KENTUCKY

ST. JOHN, Dec. 31.—The ferry steers recently purchased by Peter Clinch for the provincial government are still chewing the fine grass of Kentucky, oblivious of the efforts being made to effect their transportation here. It is understood that the scheme to bring them on via Winnipeg has been abandoned owing to the enormous expenditure that such a course would entail. They are unable of being shipped through the state of New York owing to the rigid embargo that is in force along the borders of that state so that whether a special dispensation is obtained from the federal government or not, difficulty will be experienced in landing the animals here. Indeed the only hope now held out to those interested in the scheme is that owing to the reported dying out of the disease the embargo will be lifted sooner than expected. No new cases of the foot and mouth disease have been reported in the case of New York for a period of some weeks, and it is now thought that the affection is well in hand.

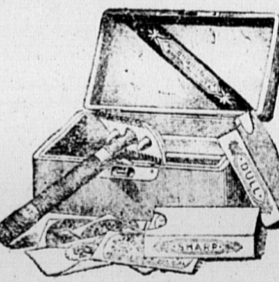
