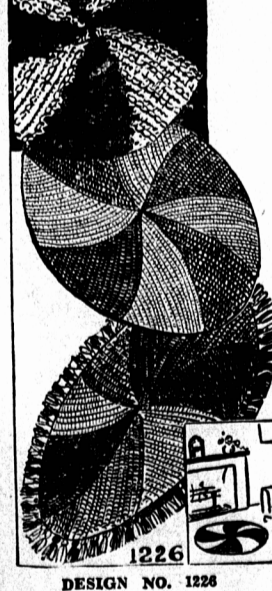
Red Cross Campaign In Charlottetown
