News Budget of Happenings Round About the District.

MR. FRANK BREHAUT, of Westboro, Mass., who has been spending a two weeks, visit with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Brehaut, Alexandria, returns home this morning.

At the sports at North Sydney, Saturday, Mr. H. H. Sutherland, St. John, well known in Charlottetown, won the one hundred yards dash, the 440 yards race and first for putting shot and second in the running high jump.

As a result of the awful mistake which caused the accident on the I. C. R. near Stellarton last week, Conductor McLeod, the two brakemen on his train, and Acting Agent Wilson, at Westville, have been dismissed from the service. Public sympathy will undoubtedly be with these men, but the management had no other course open to them in view of the verdict rendered, by the jury investigating the case.—Pictou Advocate.

It is expected that the party will be made up of the following: Rev. A. B. Simpson and Dr. H. Wilson, of New York; Rev. D. W. LeLecheur, China, and Rev. Kingman, Soudan. The principal centres will be visited, including St. John, St. Stephen, Moncton, Amherst, Truro, Halifax, Pictou, New Glasgow, Sydney, and Charlottetown. These men will bring a message along the deeper lines of truth for which they stand along with the Keswick and Northfield brethren and Mr. LeLecheur will tell the thrilling story of the opening of Tibet to the gospel message during the year.—Halifax Herald.
