Three Fast Heats in Grand Circuit

COLUMBUS, Ohio, July 10.—The three fastest heats of the year were recorded today in the Elks Home \$3,000 stake for 204 pacers, one of the features of today's Grand Circuit cards.

Jimmy McKerron won the first heat in 2:02 3/4. Hal Mahone took the second heat in the same time and the third heat in time only a quarter of a second slower. Hal Mahone was a strong favorite in the event. The first event of the afternoon, the 215' trot, brought out a field of 11 starters, with Berksdale made first choice.

David Axworthy, which ruled as second choice, won the first two heats and the event, with Berksdale taking the third one. While The Consequence won the first heat of the 2:08 trot, he and Lady Bondsman, which constituted the Mahone entry, were disqualified and not permitted to start in the remaining heats.

Alma Worth, which finished second in the first heat, was given first place because of the foul driving back of Lady Bondsman in running into Murphy, who was driving Hope Frisco. In the second heat Alma Worth broke at the home stretch and Peter S. won.

NURMI THE GREAT FINN BREAKS TWO MORE RECORDS

Crowned Himself With Glory Yesterday—Startling Achievement Gave Him Greatest Prestige Any Olympic Athlete Ever Won—Canada Scores Two Points.

COLOMBES STADIUM, July 10.—V. W. Pickard of Hamilton won fifth place in the pole vault with 3.80 metres and thus gave Canada her first two points in the Olympic field and track sports. United States was first in the event.

Belyea May Not Row
COLOMBES, France, July 10.—Hilton Belyea the New Brunswick swimmer whose racing shell was damaged in transit from England and who sent for another shell is in such poor condition that two English doctors have certified he will be unable to row in the Olympic single scull event. However Belyea insists he will be in the big race if the new shell arrives from England in time.

OLYMPIC STADIUM COLOMBES, July 10.—D. M. Johnson, Montreal, Rhodes scholar of Oxford was second in the fifth heat of the 400 metres race in the second trials today.
OLYMPIC STADIUM COLOMBES, July 10.—Paavo Nurmi the great Finn crowned himself a double Olympic winner and one of the greatest distance runners of all time today when two hours after winning 1,500 metre race, in Olympic record time, he won a thrilling victory in the 5,000 metre event from a fellow countryman, Willie Ritola, setting another Olympic and world's record. Nurmi's startling achievement gave him the greatest glory any Olympic athlete ever won in a single day.

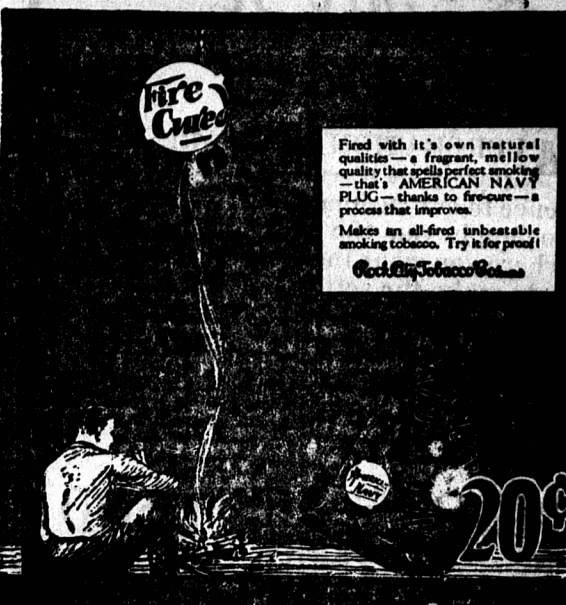
