**TROTTER IN THE MARKET.**—Anyone wishing to purchase a well-bred trotting stallion should consult W. S. McKie's ad. elsewhere in this issue.

**THE PICTOU BOAT.**—The steamer Northumberland returned from Pictou last evening at 7.45 o'clock. Her passengers included Messrs. Harvey Mitchell and Warren Pope, of Pictou.

**HAMPTON, ETC.** Presbyterian services, May 31st, will be as follows:—Bonshaw, 10.30 a.m.; Tryon, 7 p. m. The funeral service of the late Mrs. Jeremiah MacNeil, will be held at Craipud Methodist Church, on May 31st at 1.30 p. m.

**GRAND BLACK CHAPTER.**—At the recent session in Regina of the Grand Black Chapter of British North America, at which \$2,000 was voted to the aid of the Ulstermen, Mr. H. Craeswell, of Charlottetown, was elected Deputy Grand Lecturer for this Province.

**FOR P. E. I. HOSPITAL.**—The Trustees of the P. E. I. Hospital have engaged the services of an experienced nurse from one of the large London hospitals to take charge of the operating room which is being added to the institution by the building extensions that are now being effected. This lady, Miss May Turner is expected to arrive here by the end of June.

**GOVERNMENT STEAMERS.**—The S. S. Minto leaves Charlottetown at 6 o'clock this morning to go on the Marine slip for repairs. The S. S. Brant is at present at the Marine wharf taking in lighthouse supplies. She will leave on Monday on a voyage around the Island. The landing float at the east side of the Marine wharf is being thoroughly overhauled and painted. It is now in a position to accommodate gasolene boats.

**EXTENSIVE PROPERTIES.**—The ranch property of Fur Producers Limited is these days the scene of great activity. An army of men are clearing and hauling, chopping and shaping the grounds preparatory to carrying out the building program. This company purpose commencing with 66 fox pens. The Fur Farmers' Bureau purchased another farm adjoining the property of Fur Producers Limited, so that extensive operations may be carried out under effective and efficient management. Sufficient property has been secured for the construction of over four hundred fox pens.

**RETURNED FROM N. S.**—Mr. C. Leonard McKay, Grand Chancellor of the Order of the Knights of Pythias of the Maritime Provinces, on Saturday returned to Charlottetown after a visit to Nova Scotia, where he inspected all the lodges of the Order in his capacity as Grand Chancellor. He first visited on Monday the Halifax Lodge (No. 12) by the members of which he received a hearty welcome; and on Wednesday he went on to New Glasgow. On Thursday night he visited New Waterford, Cape Breton, and on Friday night Sydney. Mr. McKay found the lodges in very satisfactory condition. He says there is a great awakening in the various lodges of the Order, large numbers being added to the membership of each; and it is expected that this year will be one of the most successful, so far as membership is concerned, in the history of the Knights of Pythias. Eight or nine hundred new members are expected.

The Grand Lodge meets in Halifax on July 21st, and will continue in session to July 25th. The Halifax Lodge is therefore making tentative and elaborate preparations for the entertainment of delegates from the different parts of the Dominion, and an unprecedented attendance is looked forward to. It is estimated that between a thousand and twelve hundred members will be present. The occasion will mark the fiftieth anniversary or golden jubilee of the Order. Ranks were conferred on new members in most of the places visited by Mr. McKay. Mr. McKay's term of office as Grand Chancellor expires in July, and this was his "completing" tour of visits. He spent an excellent time in the neighbouring province.

Early transplanted cabbage 60c. per 100 Cauliflower and Celery 75c. per hundred—Late tomato plants 20c. per dozen—Extra early tomato plants 40c. per dozen—Late cabbage plants (ready 20th June) at 15c per hundred.

**PERENNIALS—WINTERED OVER.** Carnations, Sweetwilliams, Dianthus - Forgetmenots - Daisy - and Pansy in bloom at 50c per doz. Flycatcher (very choice) 60c per doz.—6 cents each—Dahlia tubs mixed 9c. each 7c per doz.

**ANNUALS.** Asters, Phlox, Verbenas, Petunia, Merigold, Portulaca, Zinnia stocks, Alyssum, Golden Feather, Nasturtium (tall and dwarf) Lobelia, Mignonette at 15c per doz. Salvia Fireball and Seeding Panacea (very choice) 20c per doz.

Please note that the following amounts for postage must be added to order when remitting—

For early Cabbage, Cauliflower and celery 10c per hundred for postage. Late tomato 3c per doz. Early tomato 5c and late cabbage 6c per hundred for postage.

The wintered over perennials 1c. each and annuals 2c. per doz. for postage.

Orders beyond the 20 mile limit unless for annuals or small quantities should be ordered to go by express—but by air means if coming to Charlottetown make it a point to call at our city market, you will save express charges and postage, and can personally select your plants.

Garden seeds such as Carrot, Beet, Parsnip, Lettuce, Radish, Cucumber, beans, Peas, etc., can be planted all June month. Our seeds are the same as we plant ourselves.
