PRICELESS AUTOGRAPHS

The visitors' books at Buckingham Palace have been replaced by two fresh volumes. The books last about three years before they become filled, and they are then put carefully away in a room in the Lord Chamberlain's department. Each book contains 500 pages, and they are bound in dark red calf, with a crown in gold in the center of the cover, and are fastened with a silver gilt clasp. In the ordinary way the books that have recently been put away would have lasted for another six months, but on the occasion of the King's death close on to eighty pages were used up in a few days—the average number of pages used in a week is between three and four.
 One of the last signatures that appeared in the old books was that of Mr. Asquith, who signed the visitors book at the Esplanade entrance when he recently called at Buckingham Palace by command of the King. One book is placed at the Ambassador's entrance, used chiefly by members of the Diplomatic Corps, and the other at the Esplanade entrance.
 The old visitors' books stored away at the Palace contains a collection of signatures that would make the autograph hunter green with envy. There are few statesmen, diplomats, divines, men of letters, financiers, soldiers, sailors or merchant princes of great note in the past hundred years, whose signatures do not appear in these books, and, in addition, they contain a wonderful collection of royal autographs.

 was ill because she drank poisoned water and displayed apparent indifference when expert chemists told that the mineral water given the patient was deadly with arsenic, that medicines contained lead poison and when a detective nurse testified that the accused offer to pay her \$1000 to administer a poison pill. Mrs. Schenk met the glances of the witness with sneers.
 Nothing of a startling nature had been brought out today, the evidence being somewhat technical, with physicians as the witnesses. But Mrs. Schenk had not been looking well all day and suddenly leaned over to Frank O'Brien, one of her attorneys and asked for a glass of water. She gulped it down and a few moments later said to another attorney: "For God's sake, get a few minutes' recess."
 The request was granted and Mrs. Schenk was taken to the jail. There she became violently sick and showed symptoms of fainting. A physician attended her and in 15 minutes she returned to the court room, but was weak and nervous during the test of the session.
