**INSECTS AND FLOWERS.** — Experiments on showy flowers like the poppy tend to show that insects are not always attracted to flowers by the brightly colored petals, but rather by the perception of dubbles by means of smell—that there is honey or pollen. In these experiments the unopened flower bud is enclosed in a gauze net so as to protect it from insects, and when it expands the petals are carefully removed without touching the remaining parts with the fingers (for bees avoid a flower if the smell of human fingers is left on it), and the petalless flowers receive practically as many insect visits as untouched flowers do.

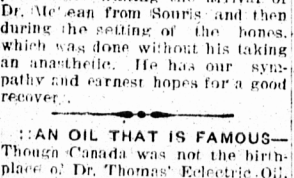

**CHINESE EGGS ON INCREASE**

OTTAWA, April 4.—The tremendous growth in the import of Chinese eggs into Canada was shown by the answer to a question put by Donald Sutherland (Conservative, South Oxford) to the House yesterday afternoon. Mr. Sutherland was told Canada imported 3,422 dozen eggs from China during the fiscal year 1920-21, valued at \$1,077. The following year the imports of Chinese eggs had grown to 46,134 dozen, with a total value of \$15,637, during the fiscal year which has just closed the imports of Chinese eggs total 149,783 dozen, valued at \$42,205.

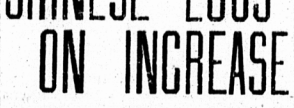

The amendment was made as a result of a suggestion from Sir Henry Drayton, who stated that while official opposition had no desire to obstruct, it was felt the usual practice of voting one-sixth of the estimates should be followed. The supply bill was introduced by Mr. Fielding.
